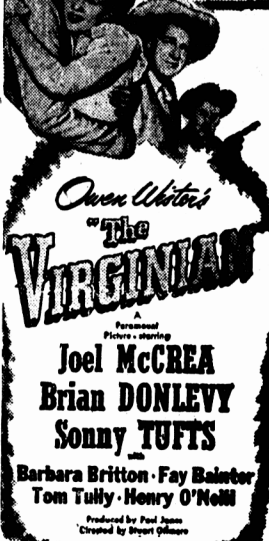

Site Secured For New Post Office At Summerside The Masonic Lodge property on the corner of Summer and Church Streets, Summerside, has been sold to the Federal Government as a site on which to erect a new post office building. It was disclosed last evening by Mr. Donald Baker, chairman of the property committee of Hiram and Lobanov Lodge. As reported a week ago negotiations have been in progress for some time and were concluded this week. The building has been advertised for sale and must be moved off by June 30th. It could not be learned at present when construction will commence but it will likely not be before 1948. This property was purchased by the Masonic Lodge more than a year ago from the Allan estate but was never used as a lodge room as they retained their rooms in the Journal building.

"THE VIRGINIAN" IN COLOR - Paramount has gone all out with its Technicolor production of Owen Wister's great novel, "The Virginian," now at the Capitol Theatre with Joel McCrea, Brian Donley and Sonny Tufts co-starring. While Technicolor films are no longer the novelty they once were, it is seldom that a subject more suitable to the artistry of the color camera is offered fans. "The Virginian" set in the ever wondrous West of Wyoming, lends itself magnificently to the new, improved color processes. In addition to endowing the film with pictorial beauty, Paramount has cast it to bear out its contention that "The Virginian" is one of its most important productions of this or any other season. Three such topflight stars as McCrea, Donley and Tufts are rarely found in any single picture. McCrea has the title role and his portrayal of the staunch defender of law and justice is said to be the best in a career of excellent portrayals. Donley returns to the kind of part that used to be associated with his name before he turned hero in "The Great McGinty" - that of "heavy". He plays Trampas, cattle-rustler, and he plays him with a smooth villainy that is so successful viewers believe it should keep him on the rocky path of movie lawlessness a while. Tufts will be seen as Steve, the Virginian's best friend, who goes the way of Trampas in spite of McCrea's warning, and winds up at the wrong end of a rope.
