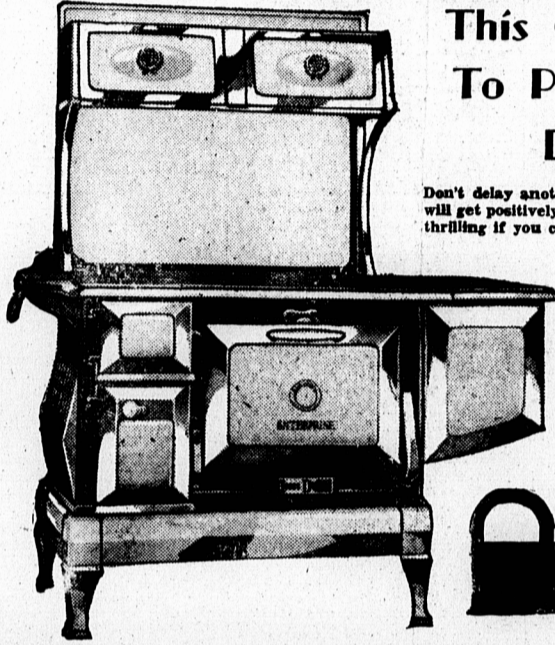

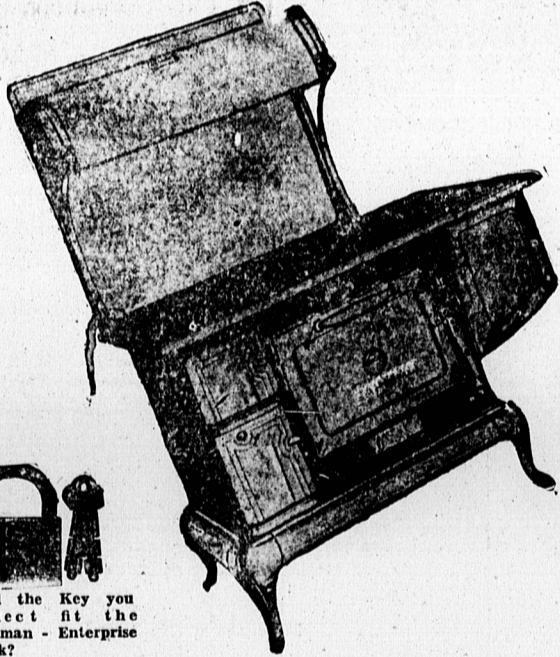

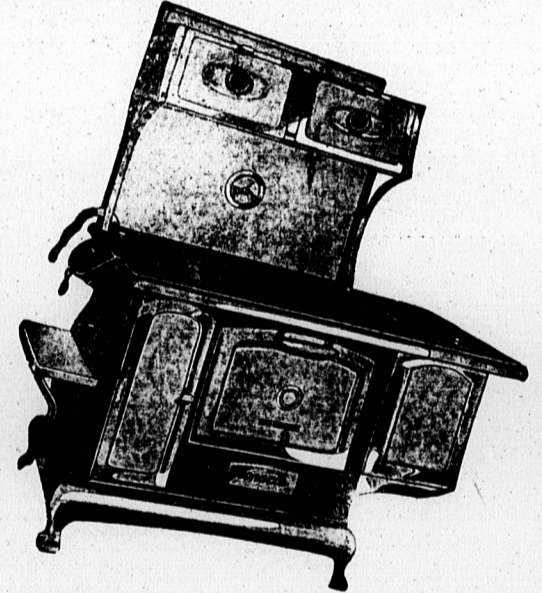

Christmas Cruises To Southern Climes

SAINT JOHN, N.B., Dec. 8.—The
cruise liner "Lady Nelson" Can-
adian National Steamships, Cap-
tain T. R. Coffin arrived at Saint
John this (Tuesday) morning with
passengers returning from holiday
cruises to Bermuda and the Le-
eward and Windward Islands, Bar-
bados, Trinidad (British West In-
dies) and British Guiana.
Cargo consists of sugar, molasses,
bananas, coconuts and general.
The Lady Nelson will sail from
Halifax on December 17th next via
Boston on a return voyage to Ber-
muda the Islands of the Eastern
Group of the British West Indies
and British Guiana with an ex-
tensive list of Christmas and New
Year cruise passengers. Christmas
will be celebrated on board the
ship calling at St. Kitts and Nevis
on Christmas Day while New
Year's will be observed at George-
town, British Guiana. Other Christ-
mas cruises by Lady liners sailing
from Halifax will be the Lady Som-

ers December 10th and the Lady
Rodney December 24th for the
Bahamas and Jamaica via Bos-
