STREET SYSTEM SOLD AT AUCTION. NEW YORK, N. Y., Dec 29--The old Metropolitan Street Railway Company owning 161 miles of New York's surface system and capitalized before it went into the hands of a receiver in 1907, at \$139,665,000, was sold at auction today for \$12,000,000 to the company's four and five per cent bondholders. The value of the company's property is estimated at \$120,000,000.

The Canadian company has not been called upon to meet the adverse conditions which have affected the American concern.

NEW HAVEN WOMEN MUST STOP SMOKING

NEW HAVEN, Conn., January 1. --Because young people insist on making cigarette smoking a feature of their afternoon social gatherings, a general war on tobacco, with Dr. Jay W. Seaver at its head, is to be started here. Dr. Seaver, who was for many years director of the Yale gymnasium, has been making some alarming discoveries, as a result of which he has determined to organize a branch of the Non-Smokers' Protective League in New Haven.

"Smoking is bad enough anyway," said Dr. Seaver to-day, "but when our young girls take it up it is time we did something to check the evil."

"I happen to know that the young girls of New Haven have taken up the habit. I know of one society in the girls' high school here which used to meet afternoons to plan good work and to discuss healthy things. Everything else has been forgotten in their love of tobacco."

"There is a young woman's literary society here, too, the members of which used to meet for real literary purposes. Now they spend the afternoons smoking. Not only the impropriety of smoking but its dan-

gers have been pointed out to these girls, but they will not heed.

"The only thing to do is to enforce the laws. There are laws in this state regulating the use of tobacco, the same as there are laws regulating the use of liquor. The Non-Smokers' Protective League was organized to enforce these laws. There is certainly plenty of room for the work in New Haven, and I propose to take it up. A number of men

and women who have discovered the same conditions that I mention will join me in this work. If we don't accomplish anything more than stopping young girls and women from smoking, the work will be worth while."

Dr. Seaver added that cigarette and pipe smoking is also on the increase among the students of Yale, and that the league will fight this.
