THE special with the mails left for Cape Traverse as usual last night but up till midnight had not got to Emerald. The regular train was running without difficulty on the N.B. and P. E. I. Railway yesterday.

Joseph Cameron was before the Court for assault on Lena Anderson Francis but the complainant did not appear and he was dismissed.

THE congregation of St. Peter's Cathedral held a meeting last night to further consider the question of erecting a rectory. A report was presented by the committee appointed at the meeting held last Wednesday to consider the question of finances, the plans, tenders, etc. After a full discussion a ballot was taken, with the result that the meeting declared itself almost unanimously in favor of the project. Messrs. Carvell, Hogg, W. F. Mitchell, F. R. Foster and R. W. Cotton were appointed a building committee to conduct the business of the undertaking in conjunction with the Priest Incumbent. The new building will be situated on the corner lot opposite the back of the church on Fitzroy Street. The estimated cost including the purchase of the land is \$2800. The plans are by W. C. THE announcement in yesterday's Guardian of the death at Victoria, Crapaud of James B. Palmer was read with regret by many in town and country. He was of a kind and affectionate disposition and enjoyed the esteem and respect of a large circle of friends and acquaintances who will mourn his loss. Some six years ago he disposed of his farm at DeSable and retired from active life to his residence at Victoria, where he has lived with his daughter, Miss Ida, till his death.

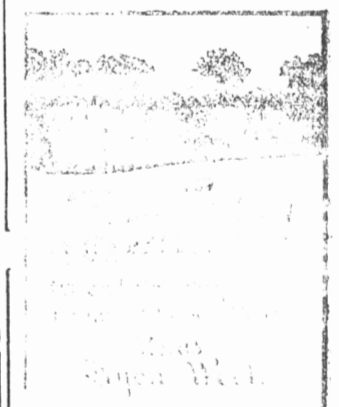
