**Industrials Show Strength At Montreal**

MONTREAL, Jan. 12 (CP)—Industrials showed strength in nearly all groups in moderate trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market today. Oil stocks extended last week's upward trend and utilities were firm. Paper issues dipped to lower price levels. The majority of price changes were fractional. Mines displayed easier tendencies in light dealings.

Closing averages indicated banks up .08 at 27.76; utilities up .7 at a new high of 74.3; industrials unchanged at 125.1; combined up .2 at a new high of 108.1; papers off .93 at a new low of 362.55. Golds off .85 at a new low of 73.2. Approximate industrial sales were 45,700 shares and mining sales totalled 116,400 shares.

In utilities, Winnipeg Electric gained 1 7-8 to touch a new high of 24 1-4 on a turnover of 3,610 shares. Ottawa Power advanced unchanged at 125.1; combined up .2 at a new high of 108.1; papers off .93 at a new low of 362.55. Golds off .85 at a new low of 73.2. Approximate industrial sales were 45,700 shares and mining sales totalled 116,400 shares.

In oils, International Petroleum and B. A. Oil added 1-4 each to 15 3-4 and 24 1-2, respectively. Imperial Oil held steady at 16 1-4 on a turnover of 3,006 shares. Home Oil moved up 10 cents at 6.40 and Omnitrans was 2-2 better at 14 on a turnover of 32,000 shares. On the negative side were Anglo-Canadian off 14 cents at 5.00 and Gaspe off four cents at 1.55.

Donnacona was up 1-4 at 23 and Abitibi went forward 1-8 at 20 1-4 in papers. International Paper dropped 1-4 at 57 1-2 and Consolidated Paper was shaded at 13 5-8 on a turnover of 1,219 shares. Bank of Commerce gained 1-4 at 23 and Southmount, on a turnover of 275 shares, added one cent at 39 in finance. Argus lost 1-4 at 7 1-4. In carriers, C.P.R. was up fractionally at 14 7-8 while in metals, International Nickel was down 1-4 at 34 1-4.

Labrador lost 14 cents at 7.00 and MacDonald dropped four cents at 1.65 in mines. Bob's Lake lost two cents at 16. On a turnover of 9,300 shares, Quebec Managene slipped one cent at 55.

There were 171 issues traded on the two markets today of which 53 were higher, 49 lower and 69 remained unchanged. Five new highs and three new lows were established.

**Livestock**

MONTREAL, Jan. 12 (CP)—Trading was active on the two Montreal livestock markets today and light receipts since the past two weeks kept prices steady. Receipts: 679 cattle, 787 calves, 801 hogs, 799 sheep.

Steers ranged from 11.50-16 according to quality. Good quality steers were 15-16 with medium kinds selling between 13.50-14.50. Heifers ranged from 8-15. Good butcher cows made 11-12 with a few selling in mixed lots as high as 2.50, including steers and heifers; medium kinds 10-11 and common butchers 8.50-9.75. Canner and cutter cows were 6.50-8 with an odd cow selling as low as 8. Bulls ranged from 8-12 according to quality.

Veal calves were in very good demand at prices ranging from 15-23. Good quality veals were 22-23 with medium kinds selling from 20-21. Drinkers or palf calves were from 13-18. Grassers, 10-12 with the bulk of the sales between 11-11.50.

There were no early sales made on hogs. Buyers were bidding 28.50 for Grade A and sellers were asking 29.

The bulk of the lambs were of common to just medium quality and sold in mixed lots at prices ranging from 16-18.50. Most of the lambs offered were bucks and common quality lambs. Sheep ranged from 7-8.75 with an odd sale at 9.

**Mining Stocks Moved Down Yesterday On Toronto Exchange**

TORONTO, Jan. 12 (CP)—The majority of mining stocks on the Toronto Exchange today eased off in quiet trading. Bear Exploration headed the mining section on turnover. Western oils were soft as profit taking cut the list.

The exchange's closing index showed golds down 86 at 102.52, base metals 29 at 90.55, western oils 1.06 at 36.22.

Only four western oils posted minor gains with losers including Anglo-Canadian, Calmont, Dai-housie, Foothills, Roxana.

Senior golds eased fractions for Hollinger Kerr, Addison, Lake Shore and 5 down at \$3.35 for Teck Hughes and 15 at \$2.25 for Wright Hargreaves. Weaker Juniors were Anglo-Rouyn, Caribou, Central Patricia, Chesterville, O'Brien, Pickle Crow, Pioneer, Springer, Galmers included Akalt, Amalgamated Larder, Negus, Preston. Bear Exploration traded about 168,000 shares to advance 13 cents at 88 on news of settlement of litigation with Yellowknife Mines.

Western oils listed 4 gains, 13 losses, 5 unchanged; mining issues 36 gains, 98 losses, 73 unchanged.

**BEST INSURANCE AGAINST MEDICINE-CHICKENS**

Confine all medical supplies, "jabbers," "poisons" and all liquids, capsules, tablets and powders marked with cautionary phrases.

Examples of medicines commonly found in the household cabinet which physicians say should be removed from easy access are morphine, morphine derivatives and other narcotics; corrosive antiseptics; bichloride of mercury; tincture of iodine; lysol or phenol. Even rubbing alcohol should be kept behind lock and key.

The following aids, or others of like characteristics, are household items which physicians in general consider safe enough to keep in an unlocked cabinet. These are analgesics or pain-killers, such as acetylsalicylic acid capsules or tablets; antacid powders, such as sodium bicarbonate; epsom salts; all saline laxatives; first-aid materials, including borax ointment, vaseline and all non-poisonous antiseptics. Almost all toiletries may be admitted into an unlocked cabinet.
