Recruits for Navy sought

Lieut. E. H. Saunders, who recently arrived from Halifax, will recruit a limited number of signalmen for the Navy today and Monday. He was sent here to act as Naval Recruiting Officer at the local R.C.N.V.R. barracks.

Lt. Saunders is a Charlottetown man. He is a brother of Sub-Lieutenant Douglas Saunders who is now attached to the Royal Navy. The signalmen are needed immediately and will be sent to Halifax where they will be given a course. Recruits are required to have a grade ten education.

In the meantime other recruits are being signed up for duty daily. Tradesmen are always in demand. It is understood that 300 naval ratings have already been accepted for service at the Charlottetown training centre. About 80 men are in training at the Charlottetown barracks at present.

Italians claim British ships suffer damage

ROME, May 9 (AP) - The Italian command today claimed torpedo and bomb hits on two British battleships, an aircraft carrier, two cruisers, a destroyer and three merchant ships and destruction of 16 British planes.

The daily war bulletin asserted the fighting started when a British convoy was sighted yesterday in the western Mediterranean and continued into the night with fascist planes scoring repeated hits with bombs and torpedoes on the British vessels. It did not claim that any of the ships were sunk.

No British airmen were mentioned in this reported brush. It was expected immediately British engagements usually run a day or two before the Italian communications. When they are finally issued the Italian victories in most cases turn out to have been fables.

U. S. Rounds Up Italian Aliens NEW YORK, May 9 (AP) - Fashionable hotels, clubs and restaurants were invaded today by immigration inspectors and city detectives staging the second round of the week against foreigners suspected of being in the United States illegally.

The quarry this time consisted of Italians, mostly waiters. Seized in raids in several cities Wednesday were 169 German seamen, all charged with overstaying their leave in the United States.

Repeating Wednesday's procedure by moving swiftly and with no advance warning, the officers made 26 arrests within three hours, and officers armed with warrants tonight were still engaged in the search.
