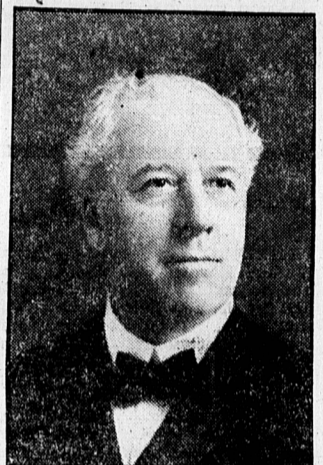

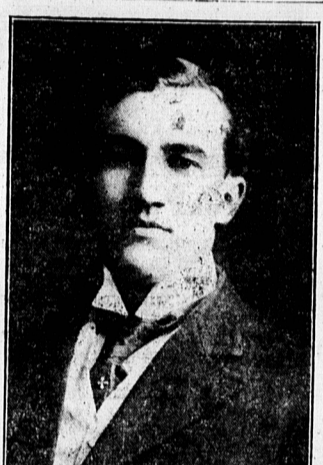

While all these are only rumours, and the places where these things are done, are few, yet we consider it most regrettable that any of them should be done at any time, and in any place, and would urge upon every friend of the Lord's Day that now, when these practices are in their incipient would be the best time to prevent their development.
