THE all Canadian footballers left for home on the Pretoria on the 12th, except Marshall of Hamilton and Farrell of Halifax. The latter has got a commission in the West African frontier field force and is going there in a few days. The tour has been a failure financially, and the team members are hit hard. THE school for instruction on dairy similar in the one conducted by Prof. J. W. Mitchell, Truro, last year will be opened at the Pasteurized Milk Society this morning. The work will be under the superintendency of Professor L. A. Zafelt, instructor in the Kingston, Ont., Dairy School. The course will comprise a two weeks course in cheese making with lectures.

THE annual meeting of the Souris Dairy Association was held in the Court House last week. The Board of Directors for last year were re-elected. It was decided to have milk purchased by test in the future. The annual statement shows that although the Company handled the same quantity of milk last year, the higher prices enabled a larger amount to be paid the patrons.

THE condition of John McAleer, teamster for L. C. Worthy, who was shot in the thigh, shortly before midnight, Friday night, is not considered dangerous. William McCallum, who conducted the barroom with his brother Daniel, at the corner of Euston and Queen, and who fired the shot, cannot yet be found, though the Police have made all efforts to locate him. The shooting commenced in a row between the bar-tender and McAleer as to who should pay for drinks called for. McAleer refused to go out as ordered, whereupon McCallum drew the 32 calibre revolver and fired. The bullet entered McAleer's right thigh and followed the bone to five inches above the knee. After breaking several panes and cutting his hand with the glass McAleer started for his home and with the assistance of Sergeant Bradley and Officer Taylor reached his house, near Boyle's tannery. Dr. Kelly was called and Saturday McAleer was taken to the City Hospital.

THE Maritime Farmer says: We note that the cool-curing room question was debated at the Western Ontario convention by R. M. Ballantyne, President of the Produce Merchants' Association, and Prof. J. W. Robertson, with the result that an aspect of the case which shrewd men have been considering and passive persons have overlooked, was strongly presented on both sides. No one questions the efficacy of the cool system of curing export cheese. Mr. Ballantyne is one of its strongest supporters. But, he maintains, it is wrong for the authorities to select localities and erect stations for illustrative purposes, because it furnishes proof for the statement of one of our recent contributors that such support merely helps appreciation to lapse into indifference. He may be right, from his point of view. There seems to be a very easily attained limit to co-operation amongst farmers, and we incline to the belief that the curing stations which attain the highest success will be owned and operated by separate aggregations of capital. Prof. Robertson's defence was vigorous, characteristic of the man. When he found that the system lately used in this country was the correct one, he threw every energy to getting that point before the people at once and the government stations were undoubtedly the quickest means. The saving to the cheese industry as a result of the adoption of cool-curing will more than offset all the cost in less than one season. It now only remains for the people to take hold of the matter. A strong point in the debate was made by another speaker who pointed out that the joint conferences and criticisms of the makers whose factories were represented in the station, resulted in the attainment of a much more uniformly high standard within a short time.

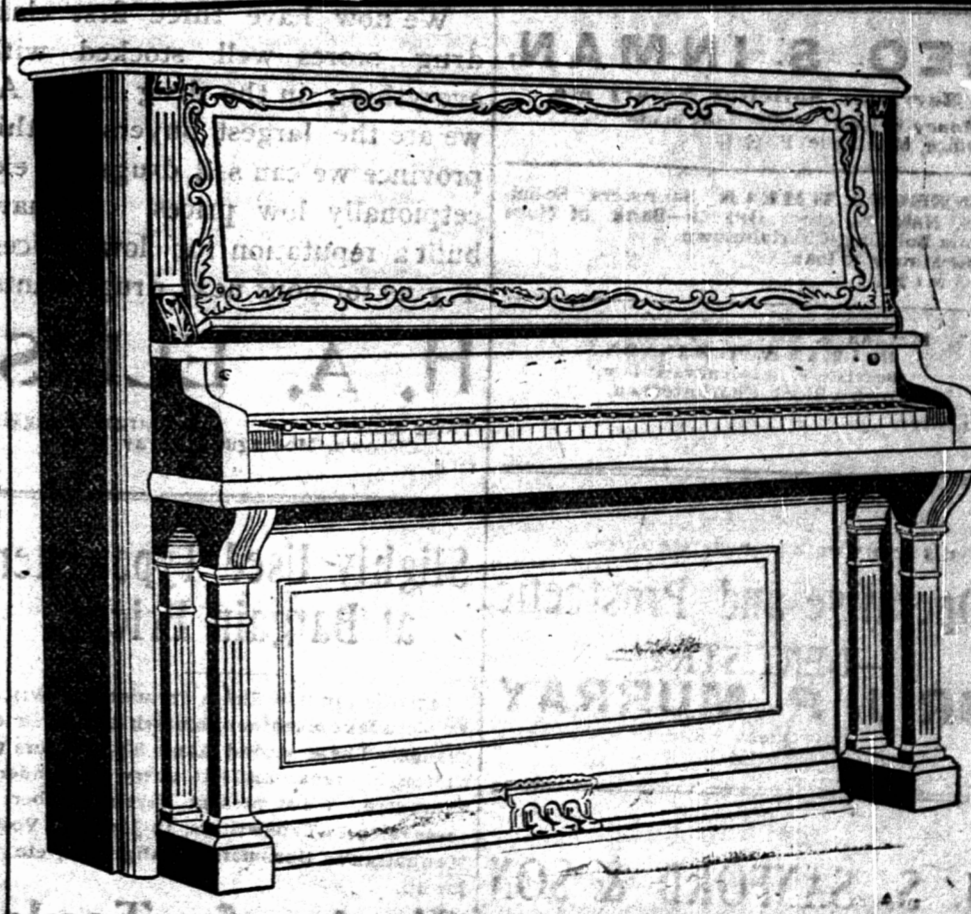
