year, the attendance at the College annually became greater, until last year fully two hundred students were enrolled. 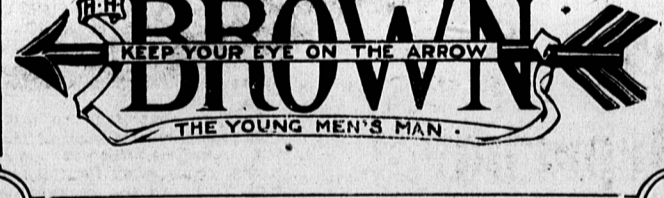
