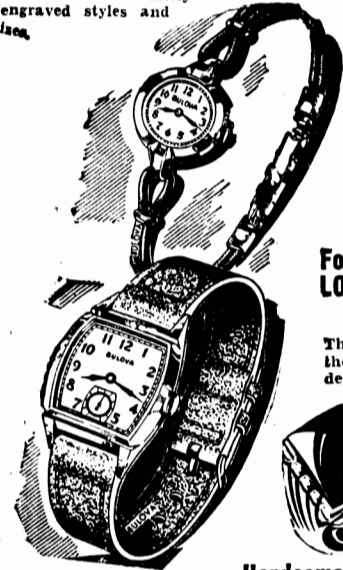

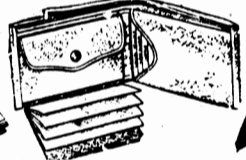

## Alberta Farmer Is Also Famous As Rose Grower

RICH VALLEY, Alta., Dec. 8 — (CP) — Approaching his 70th birthday with a twinkle in his eye, Georges Bugnet says he is never going to retire. Mr. Bugnet, a philosopher and author, also is a farmer and plant breeder at his home here 50 miles northwest of Edmonton. His reason for eternal life, given with tongue in cheek and in a French accent not lost in more than 40 years in Canada, is that it takes five years to cross-breed a rose. By the time one five-year period has elapsed, he has started on another. He maintains no rose-grower can die with an experiment half finished. Recently, Mr. Bugnet received a letter addressed: "M. Georges Bugnet, Alberta, Canada." It was delivered promptly. This was possibly due to his fame as a rose-grower. He has had letters from many countries concerning his thornless rose, the Theresa Bugnet, which took him 25 years to produce. This rose grows six feet in height, begins to bloom at the same time as the native wild rose in the middle of June, and retains its bloom until the hoarfrost comes. It is durable, fragrant and a double rose.

### Four Roses Mixed

To develop the species, he obtained some seed of the Kamchika rose, which grows in the extreme northeast of Siberia, from Petrograd just before the Russian revolution of 1917. He cross-bred the Russian rose with the Canadian wild rose and further developed it by cross-breeding with other roses, including a Japanese double rose.

He was educated in his native France and attended the famed Sorbonne University in Paris as well as the University of Lyons. In 1904 he became attracted to Canada by colonization posters which, with pictures, showed how easily \$25,000 could be made in Canada.

That decided Mr. and Mrs. Bugnet came to Canada in 1905 and in the Fall of that year homesteaded at Rich Valley. They still have to make the \$25,000 but that's the least of their worries.

At the age of 40, Mr. Bugnet found himself with a new career. The winter of 1919-20 was long and cold and he began to write. Since then he has written six novels, a book of poems and a number of essays. Critics have called him one of Canada's greatest French-language authors.

His nine children are spread over Canada and he lives here with his wife and one grandchild.

## Rise And Decline Of Animal Cycles Studied In West

EDMONTON, Dec. 8 — (CP) — Dr. William Rowan, an Edmonton zoologist, is preparing a research program through which he hopes to explain why the population of fur-bearing animals and game birds rises and falls in cycles.

Dr. Rowan feels that if he can determine the reason for these cycles, it will be a great benefit to the fur industry and to sportsmen.

The scientist says that one of the most marked examples of the population fluctuations in animals is the 10-year cycle through which the rabbits multiply at such a rate that at a population peak there is a dip and the area is covered with the skeletons of dead rabbits.

The same cycle is apparent also in the populations of practically all members of the grouse family, the Hungarian Partridge, the pheasant and several other smaller birds. The majority of fur-bearing animals also go through a similar cycle.

Dr. Rowan says the 10-year cycle through which these animals pass in population increase and decrease has two significant features—it is confined to the north temperature latitudes and is found in a belt which runs around the world.

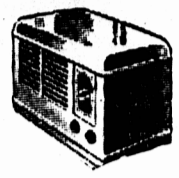

### Decline Is Nutritional

One explanation which Dr. Rowan has advanced is that the decline in animal population is nutritional — when there isn't enough nutritious food the animals die off. But what Dr. Rowan says he wants to know is why the nutritional value of food varies.

He does not subscribe to the theory that when the animal population is too large there is insufficient food and the animals die off.

Because rabbits reproduce quickly, Dr. Rowan will use them in his experiments. They will be enclosed in an area of several acres which is as near as possible to their natural habitat.

For more than two years, Dr. Rowan and his assistant, J. E. Moore, will subject the rabbits to a diet which has been controlled in nutritional elements. If his experiment is successful, Dr. Rowan plans to include his students at the University of Alberta in a later experiment which will try to produce an artificial population rise among the experimental animals.

### IN MEMORIAM

#### HOWARD RAMSAY

Howard Ramsay of Hamilton passed away to his reward on November 17th, 1948 after a period of failing health, in the 82nd year of his life. Well known and highly respected in this whole countryside. Born in 1867 the oldest in the family of the late James (repeated) Ramsay. He grew up in their farm home and in turn came to be an industrious, intelligent and successful farmer. Quiet and unassuming he gave good service through the instirment of his excellent farm. It was always a pleasure to visit his beautiful acres by the shores of Malpeque Bay and to be entertained in his hospitable home.

Honest and honorable in all his dealings he was a most useful and public-minded citizen always ready to co-operate in any movement for the welfare and progress of the community. Better public services whether of roads or telephone, or mails, or any other improvement he always supported. For many years he was the faithful and painstaking secretary of the district school board. The historic Princeton (Malpeque) Church formerly Presbyterian now United had his loyal devotion. He sang acceptably in the church choir for over sixty years and every enterprise of his Church had his hearty support. He was for forty-five years an elder of the Congregation and was quite

frequently a member of the higher courts of the church. He leaves to mourn besides his wife (nee Florence MacDougall of Victoria West, P. E. I.) two sons, Douglas, of Toronto and James who occupies the farm and two daughters Hazel, Mrs. W. Helen Ellis of Sheffield Mills, N. S. Helen of the Prince of Wales College staff, Charlottetown, also a sister, Mrs. W. D. Burgess of Waterville, N. S. and three brothers — Rev. Dr. J. A. Ramsay of Moncton, N. B., Rev. Dr. E. H. Ramsay of Saint John, N. B. and Fred W. Ramsay, Hamilton, P. E. I., a brother-in-law, Fulton of O'Leary and a brother, Mrs. F. J. Lockerby of Hamilton, predeceased him. The funeral services Friday afternoon in the home and in Princetown United Church were chaste and impressive and largely attended. The Rev. James Gross, minister of the church spoke from Matt. 25-21. "Well done good and faithful servant... enter thou into the joy of thy Lord." He was assisted by Rev. Russell Woodside of Tryon, a friend of the family. There was a full choir, a special number, the hymn "Nearer, My God to Thee" was sung as a tribute to the memory of the deceased by the Kensington Male Quartette — Messrs. Walker, MacKay, Brown and Taylor. There were many beautiful floral tributes in loving memory of the deceased. The burial was in the family plot in the Peoples Cemetery. 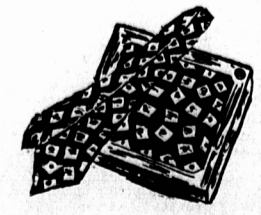
