Popular Physician Dies In Dalhousie

Dr. A. G. Ferguson's Health Impaired by Long and Faithful Service in Restigouche—Was Son of Hon. John Ferguson, Confederation Senator

DALHOUSIE, April 14.—Dr. A. S. Ferguson died at his residence, "The Red House," at 8.30 a. m. Sunday after an illness of about two months. For nearly thirty-four years he had practised his beneficent profession in Dalhousie and the surrounding district. A friend to the poor, skilful in his work and faithful in every duty appertaining to his profession, he was the ideal physician and as such he will be sorely missed in many a home. His unremitting attention to duty wore down his magnificent physique and he passed to his rest at the comparatively early age of fifty-nine. His place will be hard to fill.

The doctor was born in Bathurst. His father, John Ferguson, partner in the firm of F. Rankine & Co., lumber merchants, was called to the senate at the time of confederation. His mother was the daughter of Judge Munro, who represented the county of Gloucester at Fredericton.

IN MEMORIAM
MR. ROBERT B. MUTCH

Word has been received by Mr. Wm. Mutch, Rocky Point, that his brother Robert M. Mutch, Camrose, Alberta, had passed away March 21st, having succumbed to that dread disease, cancer. He was a great sufferer, having spent two months in Rochester in the earlier part of last summer for medical treatment, but all of no avail, and his spirit took its flight on the above date, leaving to mourn a sorrowing widow and five children, (a son predeceased him a year ago) also two brothers and three sisters to mourn their sad loss.

MISS GERTRUDE McDONALD

The death occurred in Boston, March 15th, of Miss Gertrude McDonald, at the early age of twenty years. She had been ill for the previous nine weeks and notwithstanding all that medical skill could do she gradually failed till the end came to relieve her of her suffering. The deceased was of a kind and sunny disposition, and her many friends will regret to learn that she has passed from their circle. Yet still the influence of her gentle and unselfish life was an inspiration to all who knew her.

In June of the year 1920 she completed successfully a business course in the Union Commercial College, Charlottetown, and in October left for Boston, Mass., to take a position there. Early in the summer of the same year the deceased became a member of the Hartsville Church and later, had her membership transferred to the First Presbyterian Church, Boston. Many beautiful flower offerings were received from friends among the members of the Church she attended that will express the affection they had for her.

A funeral service was held in the Presbyterian Church, Boston, conducted by the Rev. Isaac Ward, D. D. Services were held at her home in Fredericton and at Springton, New Brunswick, at which Rev. John Sterling officiated. There remain to mourn, her parents Mr. and Mrs. William McDonald, Fredericton, three brothers, Angus of Calgary, Alberta, Donald and Norman at home and one sister, Jean of Boston, Mass.

Of her passing it may be said she did not die as one who had no hope.

ALLAN McSWAIN

Once again a home centre has been saddened by the loss of a kind and affectionate parent in the passing of Mr. Allan MacSwain who died at New Haven, March 21st at the age of 77 years.

One of the earliest residents of the community, he sought through toil and industry to establish a comfortable home amid pioneer difficulties and surroundings. The strenuous circumstances of those early years served to underpin a naturally strong constitution so that for a number of years his health was more or less impaired. During later years, however, his condition had much improved, and his last illness was due to a severe accident which completely incapacitated him and served as a shock to his whole system.
