**TYBURN BONES UNEARTHED**

(By Dominion News Service)  
LONDON, Aug. 29.—Imperious Caesar, dead and turned to clay, Might stop a hole to keep the wind away.

One's mind reverts to Shakespeare's lines in looking at heaps of human remains, including a score of skulls, which have been unearthed at the corner of Margie Arch and Edgware-road, London. The excavations have already gone down six or eight feet, and the labourers are working within a few feet of the plate in the road which marks the position where hundreds of malefactors, patriots, martyrs and regicides paid the debt they owed society of private enemies.

And the conviction forces itself on one that these grinning bones belong to a portion of the Tyburn burial ground which may have been disturbed. Cromwell, we know was dragged there with Ireton and Bradshaw, after his disinterment from Westminster. His body history tells, was buried at the foot of the gallows on which his remains had been hung.

His skull at any rate, is not among those now discovered, for it decorated Westminster Hall, and there is no record of it being returned to Tyburn. At present the undamaged skulls and some of the more important bones are in the contractor's hut, while another heap of broken remnants lies just at the door. What is to be done with them no one has yet officially decided.

As usual the teeth have survived their long burial, and grin at one in rows of more or less sharp whiteness. Lord Ferrars was one of those who died on the "leafless tree." Having murdered his steward in cold blood, and being sentenced to be hanged by the House of Lords. It was he who received the unusual permission to be hanged with a silken rope instead of the hempen one habitually used. He, however, was buried in St. Pancras Churchyard so is safe from molestation.

Tom Clinch, Claude Duval, Elizabeth Barton (the "Holy Maid of Kent") Jack Sheppard, McLean, the Hyde Park highwayman and dandy, over whose hanging woman are said to have wept for 48 hours on end, and many others of the kind were executed there and many were laid in the pits dug for them close to where they were executed, and where these remains have now been resurrected.

Then he adjures his medium to forget his history and think of him in the fullest of his powers. "I still have as great an eye for beauty as when I wore a top-hat and let my hair stream beneath it."

Then he talks of W. B. Yeats. "I am too full of my own literary interest in our work. I feel like a very ancient aunt (sic) nowadays. I am doing what is little better than picking oakum in gao."

"Have you seen your mother?" asks the medium.

"Yes, I have seen her," comes the answer. "She has not really improved in the process of dying. She is less comely now."

He continues: "I will come again if you will let me buzz on as an autumn bee meeting who was tired of hunting for fresh blossoms out of season."

All who know Wilde through his writings will readily recognize him when he speaks as follows — through the automatic spirit writing — of Arnold Bennett, whom in the message he had declared he had often read. The message says:—

"As for Mr. Arnold Bennett, he is the assiduous apprentice to literature, who has conjured solong with the wand of his master Flaubert, that he has really succeeded in persuading himself and others that he has learned the trick. But Flaubert's secret is far from him. Of his characters, one may say that they never saw a cultured thing and never do an extraordinary one. They are perfectly commonplace."

Regarding Mr. G. B. Shaw, Wilde, the arch-mastre of feeing criticism in his time, says:—

"After all, he might be called a contemporary of mine. He had such a keen desire to be original that it moved my pity. . . . He was totally without any idea of the outside of any human being, as he was utterly ignorant of his internal organs."

Wilde declared through the same medium of automatic script that the only literary artist of eminence whom he thought worthy to be his own successor was John Galsworthy, whom he describes as the "aristocrat in literature, the man who takes joy in selection."

He touches on modern woman, whose critics are so harsh in these days.

"The women of my time were beautiful," he says, "from the outward side at least. Now the woman is an excrecence. She protrudes from social life as a wart does from the nose of an nebricate."

The identity of Wilde again discloses itself in the following:—

"Being dead is the most boring experience in life, if one excepts being married, or dining with a school-master."
