HEC KILREA OF SENATORS LEADS SCORERS

MONTREAL, Nov. 26.—The significant aspect of the first official list of scorers issued this season from the office of Frank Calder, President of the National Hockey League, is that stars of the leading teams in the two sections are out in front of their rival sharpshooters. Hec Kilrea, stocky blonde left winger of Ottawa Senators, the one unbeaten team in the Canadian division of the race, tops all scorers in either division. He has notched ten goals and furnished a pair of assists.

Little Aurel Joliet, the clever left winger of Canadiens, is second to Kilrea, with six goals and two assists while the irrepressible "King" Clancy, dashing Ottawa defence man is tied with Joliet on points, five goals and three assists. Dave Trotter, high priced Olympic recruit to Montreal Maroons, seems to have struck the stride that made him famous as an amateur, for he has scored four goals and furnished three assists.
