Bruins edge Leafs 3-2

BOSTON, March 11—(CP)—Boston Bruins fought off a last-period drive by Toronto Maple Leafs tonight and eked out a 3-2 victory that practically clinched the National Hockey League championship for them.

Down 3-0 going into the third, the Leafs came back strong in the closing minutes of the game, but Bruins had enough power left to stop the Toronto rally after two goals were in.

The result left Leafs four points behind the Bruins, and they have but two games left while Boston has three.

Goalie Turk Broda of the Leafs saw his chances of bagging the Vezina Trophy for the league's top netminder slip another notch by the result which left him with 98 goals scored against him during the season, as compared with 90 for Frankie Brimsek at the Boston end of the rink.

Whitlock Stands Out For Royals, Whitlock stood out, taking part in every goal. He scored two and had assists on the pair that won for LeClair.

MacArthur Brilliant MacArthur in the Charlottetown nets played standout hockey as the heavier Truro forwards crashed through time and time again to shellack him with rubber, and had the edge on his rival between the Bearcats' pipes.

Truro's goal advantage won tonight was off-set by the injury suffered by their diminutive star, Bob Mann. It was not known whether he would be able to make the trip to the Island for the return game. Wade of Truro was also injured.

Sydney Wins Title When Miners Fail To Appear For Second Game

SYDNEY, N.S., March 11—(CP)—Sydney Miners moved into the Maritime Senior Hockey Final tonight as Glace Bay Miners defaulted the second game of their best-in-three series for the Cape Breton Hockey League title.

President Campbell replied that Frank Gallagher, Maritime Amateur Hockey Association President, had suggested the two-of-three series after the Boates incident and he had polled the league clubs on the idea by telegraph.

Officials of the Glace Bay team, recently involved in a series of controversies over the eligibility of successive goalers, said they had ordered the team not to take the ice because they had not been officially notified the series was to be on a best-in-three basis.

The win, obtained when Sydney took the puck and shot it into an empty net, qualified Miners to meet the winner of the Saint John-Halifax Navy series for the Maritime title gained last year by Millonaires Navy when the first of the home-and-home series last night 6-3.

The Sydney-Glace Bay series started out originally as a best-in-seven affair. Miners won the first three with Bill Fraser, borrowed from North Sydney, in the nets. Then Fraser was disbanded and the league decided Miners would retain their wins.

Last night, they were told they would lose them if they used goalie Earl Boates, who had left the team previously. They played Boates, and the previous wins were wiped out, the series reverting to a best-of-three round.

Hundreds of fans were admitted to the rink free of charge tonight to see the anti-climatic end to the turbulent series. They saw Sydney's captain, Mel Snowdon, shoot the puck into the empty cage for the only "goal."
