The Tryon carriage shop now presents a scene of very active operations. During the day the ring of anvils, the hum and bustle of work can be distinctly heard, and during the evening Mr. McNeill, and his apt assistant, Arthur McInnis are busily at work in order to keep up with the rush of business. In making those few remarks the painter in connection must not be forgotten where the finer arts are produced by John F. McNeill.

Our school yard now presents a very tidy and neat appearance. The trees which were planted last Arbor Day have leaved out in verdant beauty; the well raked yard, the neat wood pile, and the handsome shrubs and flower beds call the attention of all. Another addition to the mill is a hand saw which was built according to the plans of a local mechanic, and put together in this village.

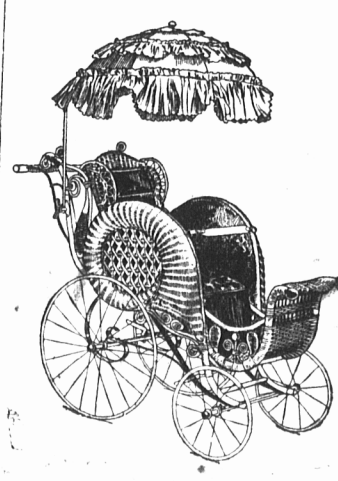
