### FROST IN SOUTH SASKATCHEWAN

REGINA, Sask., Aug. 31.—This section of southern Saskatchewan was visited by a slight touch of frost Saturday night, but so far as can be learned no damage to the grain crop resulted. Only one degree of frost was recorded at the meteorological station at the R. N. W. M. P. barracks here, while at another place in the city two degrees were shown.  
Reports to the Morning Leader by long distance telephone from Moose Jaw, Lumsden, Condie and Belton are to the same effect, namely that there were one or two degrees of frost which nipped potatoes and potato plants, and was not severe enough to affect grain unless it might be in isolated low spots. Eight degrees were recorded in the valley at Lumsden but little grain is grown there and no damage whatever is reported from the highland. In fact, practically all the grain is cut north of the valley and threshing will begin during the latter part of the present week.

### REBEL SENTIMENT GROWS IN CUBA

HAVANA, Aug. 31.—The surrender today of some of the more vigorous insurgent leaders in the provinces of Matanzas and Santa Clara, and the coming in of a scattering few insurgents in response to the government's proffer of amnesty, is vastly more than offset by the insurgent sentiment looming stranger daily in the country districts of the provinces of Havana, Pinar del Rio and Santa Clara, and which now is reported to be gaining headway in Santiago, from which province, however, there are as yet no reports of the existence of organized bands.  
The testimony of persons arriving here from the country is unanimous to the effect that the people are restless and excited.  
The undeniable evidence of the growth of the insurrectionist sentiment is causing increasing doubt as to whether the government, after all, will be able to cope promptly and successfully with the movement, and there is much discussion of the possibilities of a peaceful settlement.

### A DISH FOR TO-DAY.

Vegetarians will find in the September DELINEATOR a recipe for vegetable curry, given by Swami Abhedananda, leader of the New York Vedanta Society. He first feeds his vegetables separately in oil until they are a little more than half cooked. He then sets them aside and fries in oil, also, cloves, cardamom seeds, bay leaf, finely chopped chili peppers, etc. He then dissolves the curry powder in salted water, after which he mixes the ingredients together adding the curry last. The entire mixture is then placed in a tightly covered pan to cook gently over a slow fire until all of the vegetables become tender.

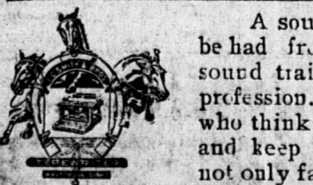
