**ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST**

JOHN D. McDonald has been appointed Harbor Master at North Pinette.

A ROYAL Salute of 21 guns will be fired by No. 1 Co. C. A., to-day in honor of the King's Birthday.

THE Princess arrived at a quarter after eight and the express at ten minutes to eleven on Saturday evening.

THE pulpit of St. James was occupied yesterday by T. C. James in the morning and Rev. M. J. McIntosh in the evening. Rev. Mr. Fullerton preached at Falmouth Street church, Sydney.

THE final football match on Saturday between the Abegweits and St. Dunstons was postponed on account of the rain. The Collegians were anxious to play though the field was in very poor condition. The Executive of the League however decided upon a postponement the time of the game to be mutually agreed on.

THE S.S. City of London had one dozen passengers a large general cargo to merchants of Crapaud on Saturday. On the return trip she had 35 packages butter for Smith & Proctor Halifax, N. S. 51 hogs for Davis & Fraser, 23 hogs for the Dominion Packing Co besides a carload of sundry other shipment for local dealers.

A NUMBER of produce laden schooners—all from P. E. Island—are at present in port. They include the B. M. Thorburn, Genesta, Sea Lark, and Can't Help It. Most of the cargoes of these vessels are consigned to local dealers, but are being retailed from the vessels. Potatoes are selling at 25 cents per bushel and turnips at 30 cents.—Sydney Record.

ON Wednesday evening, Oct. 28th, the home of John McRae of Wheatley River was the scene of a very pretty wedding, when his daughter Mary Ann was joined in holy wedlock to William Kennedy of Point Prim. Rev. George Millar performed the ceremony in the presence of upward of forty invited guests. The parlor was nicely decorated for the occasion. Miss Jessie E. McRae sister of the bride acted as bridesmaid, while Malcolm A. McLeod of Pinette supported the groom. The bride was given away by her brother William McRae and was attired in cream coloured silk with trimmings of applique and ribbon. The bridesmaid wore white organza with lace and ribbon trimmings. The wedding march was played by Mrs. William McRae. Following the usual congratulations an elegant and well appointed supper table was served after which music and games were indulged in. When the clock had some time told the dawning of another day, the guests departed all wishing Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy a happy and prosperous journey through life. The next day accompanied by a few of their friends and amidst showers of old shoes, the happy couple drove to their home in Point Prim.

At the Police Court, Saturday, J. Daniel McCallum appeared before the Magistrate for having stolen from Peter Scott the sum of \$140 in Josey's bar room on Friday Sept. 25th. The prisoner was represented by A. J. B. Mellish and P. J. Trainor appeared for the prosecution. Scott deposed that he had been taken into Josey's bar by McCallum's father about half past nine on Friday. The father then called to his son who appeared from the rear and the former disappeared by the same entrance. After the prisoner had spoken for some time Scott withdrew the money for a moment to discover if he still had it. At this point McCallum snatched it and disappeared. Since then Scott had never seen prisoner till a week ago when he met him at Brackley Point Road. McCallum asked him to make a statement which he did and then McCallum denied that he had taken the money. On cross examination Scott said he had been drinking previously. He had received a letter from A. J. B. Mellish threatening an action for slander if he did not withdraw statements he was making about McCallum. This, however had not influenced Scott in his suit. Court then adjourned till the afternoon. In the afternoon the evidence of the prisoner's father William McCallum was taken. He denied having seen the plaintiff at all on the day in question. The case was adjourned till Thursday Nov. 12, for further evidence.

St. JOHN, Nov. 5.—At a meeting of the Provincial Government here this afternoon, it is understood that the increase in the stumpage on lumber cut in the Province was decided upon. The new rate will be \$1.50 per thousand feet upon spruce and pine and in proportion upon other timber. The old rate was \$1. per thousand.
