

THE BEATTIE MURDER SENSATIONAL PROOF.

CHESTERFIELD, Aug. 29—Between gulps of intense emotion, Paul Beattie, cousin of Henry Clay Beattie, who stands indicted for the murder of his wife, revealed on the witness stand, today, that the accused told him two hours after the murder, how it was had "done it"—a circumstance relating to the crime

that the witness hitherto had suppressed. Coming as dramatically and as unexpectedly as the pathetic tale an hour before Mrs. Owen, mother of the dead woman, as to the domestic infidelity of her daughter due to her husband's loathsome condition, the brief but thrilling testimony given by Paul Beattie created a profound sensation.
