MONTREAL, April 16 - (CP)—Butter price remained unsettled but easier on Montreal open produce markets today while eggs were firm.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 22 cents a dozen for A-large, 20 to 20 1/2 for A-medium, 19 for A-pullets, 18 1/2 for grade B and 17 1/2 for C.

Butter was quoted at 25 1/2 to 26 1/2 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 while fresh solids were 28 and fresh prints 29. Grass solids were quoted at 28 and grass prints 29.

Cheese was quoted at 13 1/4 to 1 1/2 cents a pound for Ontario while Quebec were unquoted.

Grain

WINNIPEG, April 16 - (CP)—Wheat prices on the Winnipeg grain exchange followed drastic declines in foreign markets today and shot downward to levels nearly 20 cents a bushel under the seven year high of \$1.51 1/8 established April 5.

At the close of the second successive day in which values crashed the full five-cent limit the closing range was 5 to 5 1/4 cents lower with May \$1.31 3/4, July \$1.27 1/4 and October \$1.15 3/4.

All fall futures, rye futures and May and July barley slipped off the limit allowed in one day's trading but some of these commodities staged a slight recovery from low levels.

The sudden burst of selling at the opening sent all prices to their lowest levels and considerable stop-loss orders were dumped into the demoralized market. However Canadian wheat export purchases worked on the breaks and rallied prices to a partial recovery at mid session before the bottom fell out of the market again in the dull closing minutes.

Coarse grains followed the trend of wheat although the oat futures fared better with losses of only 2 7/8 to 3 1/2 cents. Other grains were down 4 to 5 cents.
