Freight Traffic Via Borden Increases

One thousand, six hundred and eighteen cars of freight were brought over from the mainland via the car ferry last month as compared to 1,351 cars during June of 1946, according to a press release from the office of the superintendent, Canadian National Railways, Charlottetown.

Imports of coal showed a substantial decrease as only 150 cars were brought over last month compared to 202 cars for the corresponding period last year. As was to be expected under a more relaxed sugar-rationing system, imports of sugar have increased from seven cars in June, 1946 to 11 cars last month.

Potato shipments were largely responsible for the increase in total exports. Eight hundred and thirty-nine cars of freight went compared to 445 in June of 1946. Of these cars, 430 were loaded with potatoes. Only 103 cars of potatoes were carried to the mainland by the ferry in June, 1946.

Heavy Fog, Icebergs Reported In Gulf

MONTREAL, July 17 — (CP) — For the fourth day in a row shipping in the St. Lawrence River and Gulf is moving through dense fog and icefields and skippers have been forced to travel at a snail's pace to prevent collision with other ships, it was reported today.

From Cape Sable, 82 miles east of Quebec, Signal Service reported dense fog while lookout men on shore near Belle Isle sighted 16 icebergs and several growlers.

Shipping is heavy along this route but no accidents have been reported.

Scientists To Seek North Magnetic Pole

OTTAWA, July 17 — (CP)—A party of Resources Department scientists were scheduled to leave Rockcliffe Airport here today in search of the North Magnetic Pole, believed to be in the vicinity of the southern shores of Somerset Island. This would place it 50 or more miles north of its old position.
