RECRUITING FOR THE ENGINEERS

As already announced, Corporal R. S. Colby, of Moncton, is in Charlottetown to carry on recruiting for the Canadian Engineers with a training and supply depot at Valcartier. This corps is organizing to consist of three full fields companies of 234 officers and men each. The full corps numbers 693, and this complement accompanying an army division. The men are at present at Valcartier, and will move to Ottawa next week. The training in Canada takes from two to three months and then men will spend three months in England before going direct to the front.

The officer commanding this unit is Lieutenant Colonel Melville, of Woodstock, New Brunswick, who has had fifteen months' experience Overseas, and two of the instructors of the Battalion have been at the front for from twelve to eighteen months each. The men of this unit are especially trained and when they reach the front their personal work is in the nature of that of gang foremen to direct the efforts of the infantry companies already in the building of bridges, repair of same, constructing water supply lines, sanitation lines, drainage, field defences, roads, supply of construction material, and finally, the work of demolishing captured enemy strongholds.

Any man with a natural aptitude for mechanical work will be accepted for the men preferred are those with some practical experience as mechanics, bridgemen, woodmen, tradesmen, electricians. Approximately 4,500 such men have been trained and sent overseas from Canada, already, and their work on the other side has been second to none. Until further orders, 400 men a month are required for engineering work with the various infantry divisions which have gone from Canada.

The composition of the Field Companies is somewhat different from that of Infantry Companies. Each Field Company is commanded by a Lieutenant, with Lieutenant as second in command, and four other subalterns in command of the four "sections" which correspond to the "platoons" in an infantry company. Some people seem to have an idea that the Engineers are a non-combatant corps.

U.S. Boat Seized At Yarmouth, N.S.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
YARMOUTH, N. S., Sept. 27.—The fisheries patrol boat "P" is in port with the Boston lobster smack E. McNichol which was seized for lobster fishing within the three-mile limit. Captain Isaac Crowell, of the McNichol, claims that he was within his rights when fishing where he was seized. The smack at the time was on Jacko Ridge, which is almost on a straight line from Cape Forchu to Seal Island and Captain Crowell contends that the three-mile limit follows the trend of the shore and not any imaginary lines. Captain Blades of the patrol boat claims the three-mile limit is from all imaginary line and if he is right, it is clear violation. The matter has been placed before the authorities at Washington by U. S. Consul Balch at Ottawa and Collector Harding and the results of the dispute are anxiously awaited. In the meantime the McNichol is held in port with \$1,200 worth of lobsters in her wells.

TRIED TO SEND RUBBER TO GERMANY

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
LONDON, Sept. 28.—In connection with the recent release for the return to America of a consignment of false teeth addressed to Germany, an official statement said today that one of the recent seizures of teeth consisted of one hundred dozen sets, some having rubber plates and others composed of materials supposedly removed badly in Germany.

The admiralty officer insisted that the stoppage of the consignments of false teeth was not part of a starvation plan.
