THE WINTER TIME TABLE

The time is approaching when the change of time table on the P. E. Island Railway will be made and go into effect. It sometimes happens that with the best intentions all around mistakes are made, or misunderstandings arise which it is desirable to avoid in the future. It is alike in the interests of the railway and its patrons that the time table shall as far as practicable serve the needs and the convenience of those who use it.

It is said and with truth that the Government Railway is the people's highway. At the same time the people recognize that it must be under official control and management, and that not all the views and wishes of different sections and classes can be carried out. There are some limitations as to the number of trains that may be run. With all these limitations in mind there must be still a broad margin within which the railway authorities could fairly meet the wishes of the people if they understand what those wishes are. It is not our purpose today to discuss what the winter time table ought to be, but simply to propose that before it is sold the business community should have the opportunity of being consulted and making suggestions as to what they desire in the way of railway service in the winter. It would seem that mutual consultation might happily avoid the troubles and gossamers that have arisen in the past. Our only desire is to get in this way the most satisfactory and smooth working time table that can be obtained. The Island has so many winter disabilities that it is especially desirable the train service shall be made as convenient as possible.

Since the above was in type we learn that the Cape Traverse train will run through to Charlotte every three mornings each week, returning in the afternoon while otherwise the winter train arrangements will be similar to those of last winter.

There is a very strong feeling that the two-cent rate for letters dropped into the Post Office for city delivery ought to remain at one cent as before the earlier system was adopted. The Postmaster General has announced his intention to
