FRASER WILL LECTURE

New South Wales Endorses the Canadian Pacific Cable Plan.

OTTAWA, May 19.—(Special)—At the meeting of the Public Accounts Committee today, Sir Hibbert Tupper moved for the presence of Shanks of Winnipeg, bookkeeper for Howell, who conducted the election frauds in Manitoba and to bring with him papers, etc. Carried.

SYDNEY, NEW SOUTH WALES, May 19.—(Special)—The cabinet after considering the Pacific cable proposition, disagreed with the imperial proposals and agreed with the American idea that the cable should be jointly owned by the colonies and Britain, and not subsidized.

TOURIST TRAVEL

Expected to Be in Excess of Previous Seasons.

MR. H. L. CHIPMAN

Discusses our Hotel Accommodation and the Travelers' Tax.

As intimated in yesterday morning's GUARDIAN, Mr. H. L. Chipman, Canadian Managing Agent of the Plant Line, arrived in the city Thursday evening. When seen by a GUARDIAN representative Mr. Chipman said that he was pleased to say something of the great system which he had the honor to represent in the capacity of Canadian Manager, and its relation to this province.

The fact that such a large steamer as the Duchess, the largest coastwise passenger steamer in these waters, carrying 600 passengers, in addition to the Halifax, giving a service of two steamers a week, being placed on the Charlottetown route, is a big venture and the Plant Line is looking for a solid patronage in order to sustain it.

The placing of these steamers is not only to increase the Company's trade but it will also be a big thing for the province of Prince Edward Island as well.



U. S. AND CANADA

American Troops Being Sent to Alaska.

TO PRESERVE ORDER

Senator Fairbanks' Mission to Examine the Alaskan Boundary.

BUFFALO May 19.—(Special)—A Washington special says that to preserve order in Alaska and to prevent a conflict between the Americans and Canadian miners which may injure the good relations between the United States and Great Britain three companies of infantry will be sent to that locality.
