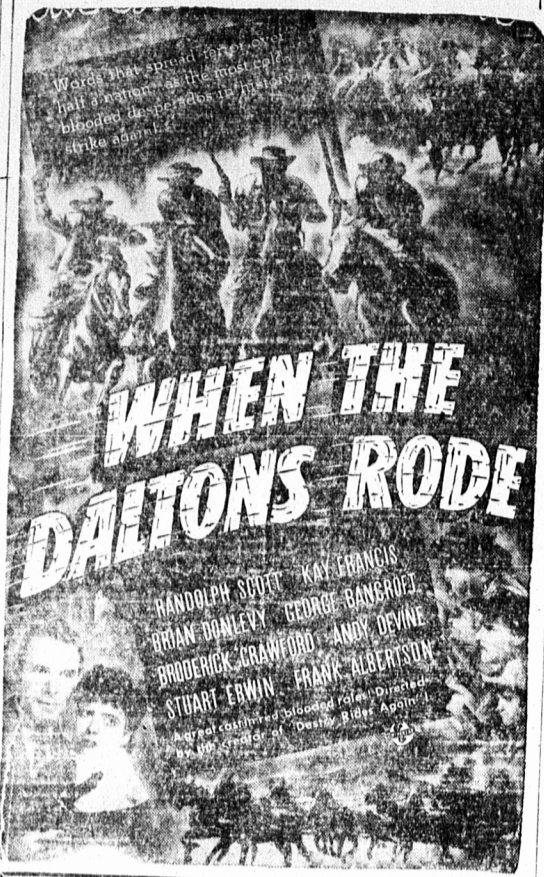

By HAROLD FAIR.— Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON, Aug. 22.— Diplomatic quarters speculated tonight that Lord Beaverbrook, Minister for Aircraft Production, may be appointed to a new post— a ministry yet to be created — that of Aircraft Production.

The purpose would be to effect an all-round speed-up in the production of planes in his present production, which was created only recently, at the recent Lord Beaverbrook is the first incumbent.

It is recalled that when the Canadian-born publisher was invited to lead the war cabinet as reward for shifting the plane industry into high gear, a statement said he would remain Aircraft Minister for the time being. Even then a higher post was forecast.

Westminster lobby speculation that Lord Beaverbrook's future is tied up with talk of a possible cabinet shuffle which is the favorite pastime here on the eve of a parliamentary holiday.

There is talk among the members that Neville Chamberlain, Lord President of the Council, and Viscount Halifax, Foreign Secretary, may leave the war cabinet, while Arthur Greenwood, Minister without portfolio, and Duff Cooper, Minister of Information, are mentioned as possibilities for other posts.

Informed sources believed, however, that the changes might not come immediately.

Doubt has been expressed as to whether Mr. Chamberlain's health, after his recent operation, will be good enough to enable him to continue as Lord President of the Council, although in letters to friends he said he is making good progress.

Some feel that since the work of this office has multiplied enormously since the war, it would throw a great strain upon him.

Price Of English Bank Notes Drops

NEW YORK, Aug. 21.—(AP)—The price of English bank notes today dropped to around \$3.15 for one pound sterling from \$3.50 after announcement London forbade import of currency.

Banking circles pointed out the restrictions had no connection with the price of free or official sterling. Brokers in foreign money reported a deluge of offerings of English money. Many forecast the price would break still further.

United States holders can deliver their English money to a local bank up to Aug. 27 and the proceeds will be credited to a registered account. Free sterling now is around \$4 and official sterling is sold by New York banks at \$4.40. Business at the first official prices is done exclusively by cables and cheques.

How To Prepare. Bordeaux Mixture

Bordeaux mixture is also used as a control for many species of flea beetles and some leaf hoppers. It is practically always used as the basic liquid when spraying for the Colorado potato beetle since it is the standard remedy for many important potato diseases. It is made by mixing copper sulphate (blue stone) hydrated lime and water together in the following proportions: copper sulphate (finely ground) four lbs; hydrated lime, six lbs. and water, 40 gallons.

The method is simplified greatly if finely ground copper sulphate and hydrated lime are used. After the spray tank has been filled with water, the engine is started and the correct amount of finely ground copper sulphate gradually added.

With the agitator running, the fine power will be thoroughly dissolved in 5 minutes in the meantime the hydrated lime is placed in a large pail and slowly stirred with a stick until sufficient water is added to fill the container. After thoroughly mixing, the liquid is then added gradually to the spray tank, while the engine and agitator continue to run. This procedure is repeated 2 or 3 times until all the hydrated lime with the exception of the insoluble foreign matter in the bottom of the pail, has been carried over into the spray machine.

Two pounds of calcium arsenate are added, when the mixture is ready to apply. Where small hand sprayers are used, the method of preparing Bordeaux mixture is exactly the same except that the agitation of the liquid in the sprayer will have to be done by means of a flat stick in the absence of an engine and mechanical agitator.

New Trans-Canada Planes Planned

MONTREAL, Aug. 22.— Delivery of the first of six new aircraft ordered by the Trans-Canada Air Lines will be made by the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation on Oct. 31. D. B. Colyer, Vice President of the T.C.A. announced today. The second will be received on Nov. 6th, two others later in the month, and the last two in December.

The new planes are Lockheed "Eighteens," larger than the present equipment, and they will be used in Trans Continental service and on the route between Toronto, London and Windsor. They will have accommodation for 14 passengers and a crew of three. The "Fourteens" now in service carry ten passengers. Nearly 50 feet long, the Lockheed is about five and a half feet longer than the fourteen. The wingspan is the same, 65 and a half feet, and the height 11 feet 10-1/2 inches. It has a cargo capacity of 100 cubic feet and will carry 64 gallons of gasoline and 44 gallons of oil.

The two Pratt and Whitney twin wasp engines develop 1,200 horsepower each at takeoff as compared with 850 horsepower engines in the fourteens. They give the aircraft a cruising speed of 232 miles an hour and maximum speed of 263 miles an hour. Like the 15 Lockheed now in service, the Lockheed is an all metal midwing monoplane and is equipped with all the latest instruments for modern scientific flying. It is furnished with upholstered comfortable seats. At each is a sheetrock glass window and each is equipped with individual reading light, call button for stewardess service and air control vent. A lavatory at the rear contains a wash basin, mirror, soap, dispenser and electric razor outlet. Equipment is provided to facilitate the serving of meals aloft by the stewardess.
