For many years the King ardent sportsman though he was, had been unable to win a Derby. Suddenly his fortune changed. For the four years ending in 1895 his winnings amounted to about \$40,000, but in the succeeding four years they went up to \$260,000. The luck turned when Persimmon fought the race inch by inch with in 1896 and won the "blue ribbon" for the Prince. Popular as he has always been in England he never received such a greeting as he did after winning the Derby.

PEKIN, June 27.—The viceroy of the province of Sze Chau has notified the government that the American and British mission buildings at Tien Ku Chao have been destroyed by a mob, and that a missionary has been murdered. His name and nationality were not reported. An imperial edict just issued deprives the local magistrate of Tien Ku Chao of his rank, and orders the extermination of the roiters. Several of the leaders of the outbreak are reported to have been beheaded.
