Currencies

NEW YORK, May 16 — Major European currencies pointed downward in terms of the United States dollar today.

Sterling lost 5-8 of a cent at \$496 3-8 and the French franc 3/8 of a cent at 273 3-8. The Belgia steadied on news of formation of a new cabinet and dropped only 1/16 of a cent. Pressure on the Guild continued for a decline of 1/16 of a cent while the Swiss franc held unchanged.

The Canadian dollar dropped 5-64 of a cent to a discount of 55-64, the lowest point since 1928, apparently following the lower trend of sterling.

MONTEAL, May 16 — Receipts of cattle, hogs, sheep, and poultry were light today.

Prices for cows were firm to 25 cents higher. Steers were down 10 to 15 cents. Hogs were firm to 10 cents higher. Sheep were down 10 to 15 cents. Poultry were down 10 to 15 cents.

With a liberal offering of calves, prices were just steady. There were no tops. Medium good to good quality yearlings were \$6.75, with medium kinds around \$6 to \$6.25. Fair to medium kinds in mixed lots were sold from \$5.50 to \$6 with quality yearlings down to \$5.25. Drinkers ranged from \$4 to \$4.75 with the bulk between \$4.25 and \$4.50.

Spring lambs ranged from \$4 to \$7 each according to weight and quality. Sheep were from \$3 to \$5.25 with the bulk between \$4.75 and \$5.

Hogs were steady at \$10.50 for bacon, and watered, with truck hogs selling up to \$10.75. Select, drew \$1 per hog premium with the usual cuts on grades. Sows were from \$7 to \$8 with an odd top up to \$8.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$14.40.

Grain

CHICAGO, May 16 — Weakness at Chicago prompted moderate acquiescence on Winnipeg grain exchange to push the May wheat back down four cents from 89 to 85 cents a bushel.


Prices closed at the bottom levels, 2 1-2 to 3-8 cents lower, say at 1.15, July 1.04 3-8 and Oct. 66 1-4 cents.

Grain futures reports from the United States southwest and poor export demand or wheat reports of drought in various sections of Australia.

Buying power was thin throughout although scarcity of offerings allowed the May future to climb 1 1-2 cents to the start.

Cash wheat closed fractionally down. Spread on no. 1 northern eased 1-4 cent and was only 1 1-4 cent premium over the May future. Nos. 2 and 3 Durums spreads declined 1-2 cent.

Coarse grain futures eased in late stages, on closing 1 3-8 lower, barley 1 1-4 to 3-4 lower, flax 1 over to 1-8 higher, and rye 3-8 to 3-4 lower.
