Taylor, who made the supreme sacrifice in Italy. The act of unveiling was performed by his little daughter Barbara, and the service was conducted by the Minister, Rev. Lewis Murray, who delivered a most impressive and feeling address. Following is the inscription on Tablet:

To the Glorious Memory of  
Lieutenant  
Arnold Dudley Taylor  
Killed in Action in Italy,  
1944.

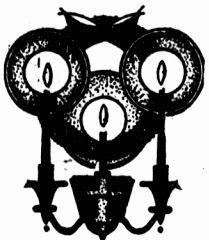
