PORTSMOUTH, Eng., July 30.—The battleship *Bellerophon*, another Dreadnought, was launched here this afternoon by Princess Henry of Battenburg. The new warship has a tonnage of 18,000, which is 700 more than the Dreadnought, and she embodies a number of improvements as a result of the Dreadnought trial.

The *Temeraire*, the third ship of this class, will be launched the latter part of August.

**Roaring Fire At Coney Island**

**Dreamland and Luna Park Have a Close Call—Escape of Freaks and Wonders in Famous Amusement Ground.**

New York, July 30.—Coney Island, the playground of New York's millions, was visited by a disastrous fire early today and seven blocks in the amusement section were destroyed. Tillyou's Steeplechase Park and nearly a score of small hotels were wiped out and for a time the flames threatened destruction to Luna Park and Dreamland, two of the largest homes of amusements, and the scores of smaller places which frequent the water edge. A lucky shift of the wind seaward probably saved the picturesque area, but not until about \$300,000 damage had been done.

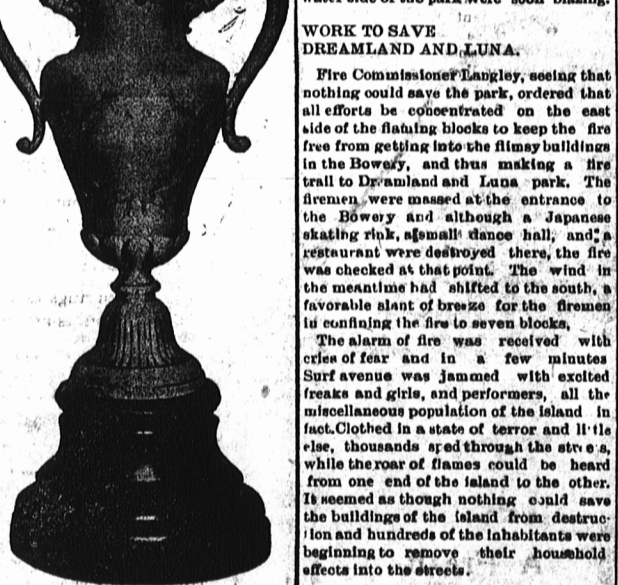
**WIND BLEW 120 MILES AN HOUR**

SUMMIT MOUNT, July 30.—A gale with a maximum velocity of 120 miles an hour and with temperature hovering just above freezing was recorded here today. The storm began to brew yesterday noon with a sixty mile wind, rising to more than 100 last midnight and attaining its climax of 120 miles early today.

At noon the velocity had decreased to 75 but had risen again tonight to 93. A heavy rain is falling. Altogether it makes one of the worst storms ever known here during midsummer. No train has been run up or down the mountains all day, and many guests are delayed at the Summit House, waiting for the storm to abate.
