THE FIRST PASSENGER STEAMER TO ARRIVE IN AMERICA.

Notes and queries has recently been discussing which was the first steamship to carry passengers from Europe to America. Mr. Everard Coleman claims this distinction for the Sirius, of Cork, and produces a evidence a copy of the New York Weekly Herald, issued in that city on April 28, 1833. This records the arrival of the vessel with 42 passengers. Eleven of these adventurous spirits were women, for whose comfort there was a stewardess.

RED MASS IN THE HISTORIC CHAPEL.

On the first day of the new law term, Oct. 31, a votive mass was said, as usual, at 10.30 in the chapel of Saints Anselm and Cecilia Lincoln-in-fields. Cardinal Vaughan was present. This is probably the last time that 'Red Mass' will be celebrated in this historic chapel. When the new Catholic cathedral at Westminster is opened the service will be held there.

THE RICHEST MONARCH.

Emperor William is undoubtedly the richest monarch in the world now that Queen Victoria's estate has been divided. He inherited more than \$30,000,000 from his grandfather thirteen years ago which was well invested and has since rapidly increased in value. He inherited another fortune from his father the late Emperor Frederick. His wife is also rich.

ROYAL YACHT ELFIN.

The work of breaking up the Royal yacht Elfin has begun. The yacht was purchased by the Prince Consort, and used by him principally to take his children for sea trips when the royal family was at Osborne.

TO SUPPLY ELECTRICITY.

A bill for the creation of a company with a capital of two million pounds for supplying electricity over the greater part of Yorkshire, has passed the House of Commons Committee.

FAMOUS ABBEY TO BE DESTROYED.

Battle Abbey, founded by William the Conqueror a year after the Battle of Hastings, is soon to be knocked down to the highest bidder.
