A FUTILE "SACRIFICE"

The reward for bidding and making a vulnerable slam is so high that non-vulnerable opponents can afford to pay a very large penalty for taking the bid away. The "catch" in this philosophy however, is that the slam bidders may have miscalculated slightly! Today's deal offers a typical illustration of this point.

Bridge deal with cards: North dealer, North-South vulnerable. ♠ A 7 4, ♥ A K 9 5, ♦ K 7 2, ♣ A K. South: ♠ Q J 10, ♥ 8 3, ♦ 3, ♣ 7 5 4. West: ♠ 9 3 2, ♥ 7 6 2, ♦ Q J 10 8 8, ♣ 7 6 2.

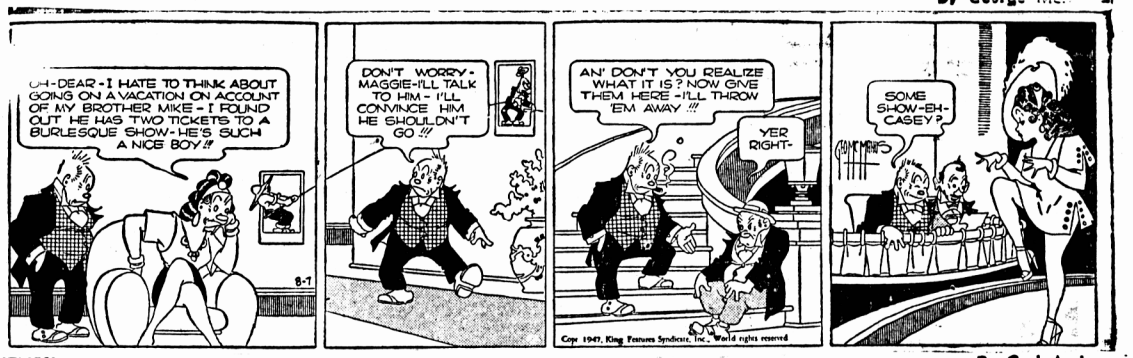

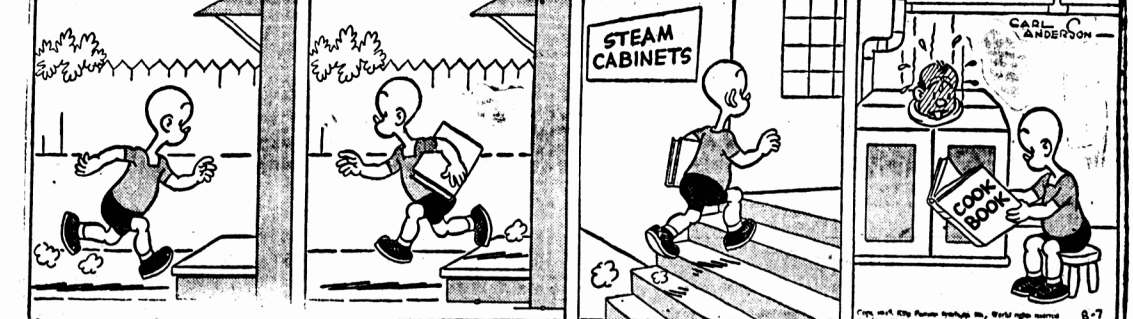

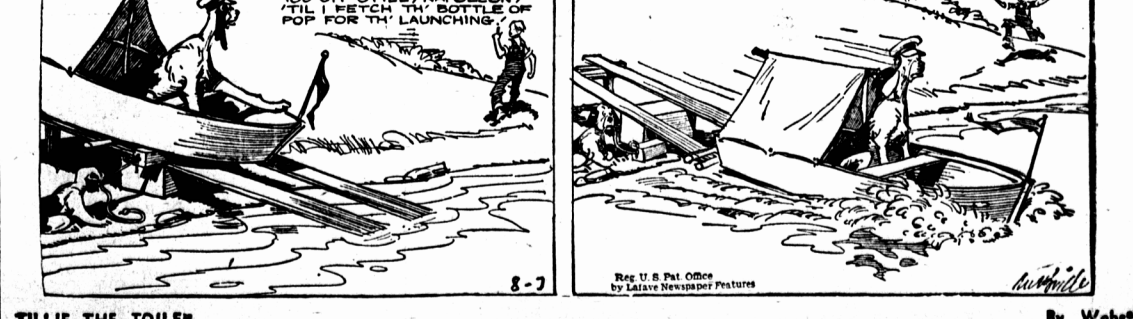
