

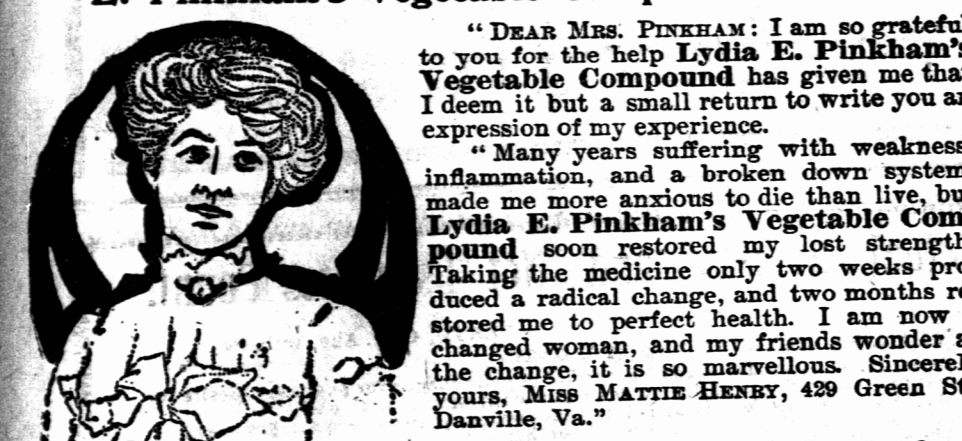

PROVINCIAL MAN DIES IN WESTBORO

James Burhoe Formerly of Alexandra Lot 49

Passes Away at a Ripe Old Age—His Son Visited Charlottetown Several Years ago.

The following is from a Westboro Mass exchange of a recent date. Mr. Burhoe referred to whose photograph also appears in the exchange has many relatives and friends in the Island and was well known in this city. A son is Rev. J. T. Burhoe of the Rockford Ill., Baptist Church who visited Charlottetown several years ago.

The exchange says:— On Friday morning, Dec. 4, at six o'clock, James Burhoe passed to his home beyond the scenes of time in a happy old age. Mr. Burhoe had been in comfortable health and in possession of his faculties to a remarkable degree, until a few days before his death, when he was seized with an attack of grip which the weakened vital forces could not overcome.

He had resided many years with his only daughter and husband, Mrs. Abbie and Mr. Samuel Burhoe, Morse Street.

Mr. Burhoe was born at Alexandra near Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, July 12, 1812. His grandfather, John Brehant, was a native of the Island of Guernsey, and migrated to America when but a youth. Mr. Burhoe comes from a long lived ancestry, his grandfather dying at the age of 90 and grandmother at 98. Mr. Burhoe's mother was of Scotch American descent. His wife was Mary Wood of Alexandra. She died August 5th, 1875, and her body rests in Pine Grove cemetery.

Mr. Burhoe has two brothers and a sister living. He has four children who are all living, the oldest, Theophilus in Nova Scotia; J. T. Burhoe, who is pastor of the State street Baptist church, Rockford Illinois; Abbie, with whom he resides, and Ingram, who lives in Westboro. Mr. Burhoe for many years lived a very active life. In 1847 he migrated to Warren, Rhode Island. In 1850 he returned to P. E. Island, settled on a wood primeval forest farm, worked at shipbuilding and cleared his farm. The peculiar toils and trials of pioneer life were his. In 1874 he came to Westboro, and since that time has lived mostly in Hopkinton and Westboro.

Mr. Burhoe was a firm believer in the truths of the Bible. He joined the church when about 22 years old and since that time, for 83 years, has been faithful to his vows. He was a member of the Baptist church in Westboro many years. He was a lover of the Bible, not simply reading it but a real devoted student of the word of God. He was a lover of music, indeed music greatly gladdened and possibly lengthened his life. He was familiar with the old church hymnals and the best Sunday school and gospel songs and tunes that have appeared during the past century. With a firm and remarkable clear voice he joined in the songs that were sung on his 80th birthday, and he loved the sacred songs and grew firmer in his religious faith until the end. He was conscious until shortly before the light of life went out and his last audible words were repeating one of his favorite Psalms.

In the death of our venerable townsman a most estimable and lovable man has gone to his reward after 91 years of heroic Christian living.

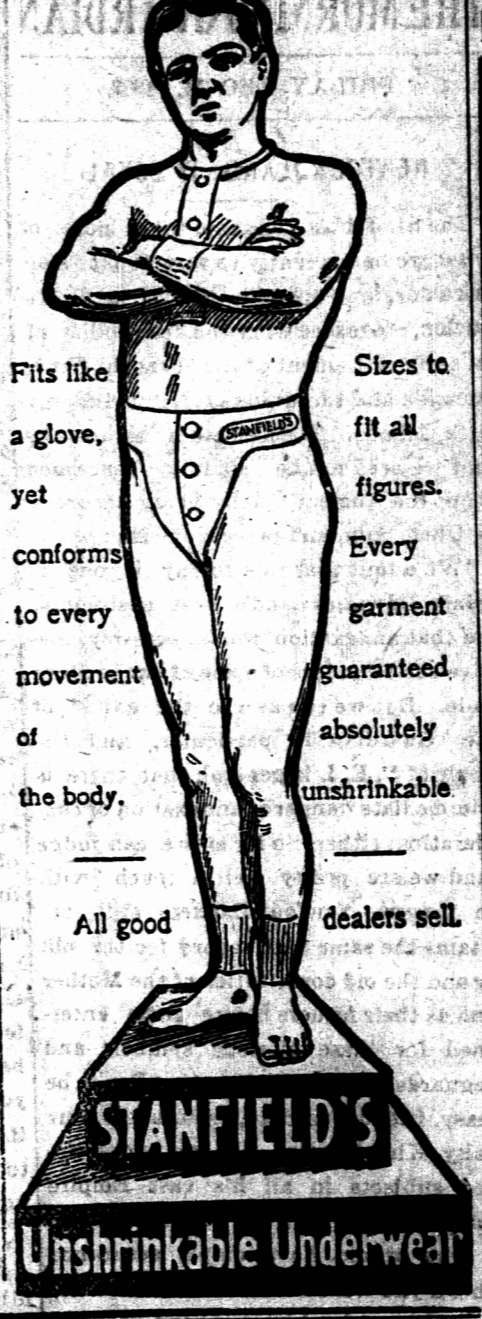
