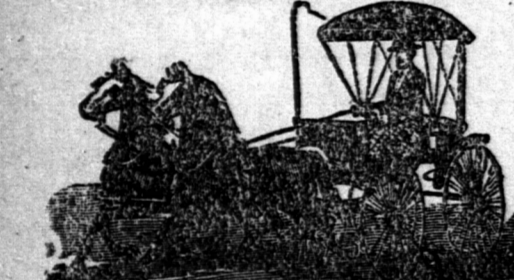

ANOTHER STAY OF PROCEEDINGS.

Following the conviction of Angus McDonald and the issue of a commitment which was not served, as noted in THE GUARDIAN of yesterday, a writ of certiorari has been obtained by the defendant's counsel to carry the case to the Supreme Court, and a stay of proceedings has been ordered, as in the Connolly case. McDonald thus for the time is able to postpone the payment of his fine, or the date of incarceration. No objections can be made to these proceedings so long as they are made in due course of law, but they serve to bring into unpleasant relief the unreadiness of the Attorney General to argue the first case, and his arrangement to postpone the argument until November next. It may be that he will require quite as long a time to argue the present case as he did in the former one, and if so the patience of the public will be severely tried.

The Examiner very properly brings under review the anomalous positions in which the City and the City Council have been placed by the conviction of McDonald. He is a member of the Council and sworn to the faithful discharge of the duties of that position. He is moreover the Chairman of the Police Committee and as such sustains an important official relation to the guardians of the public peace and order. The Council ought to have legal and moral power to purge itself and its committees in such cases, but it might be questioned whether the requisite legal power or moral stamina which the process would require are at present in existence.

The law of the land ought long ago have been framed to exclude liquor sellers, whether under license or otherwise, from sitting in our City Council. It is only in this, the supposed-to-be most temperate Province of Canada, that rum-sellers are eligible to civil or municipal councils. THE GUARDIAN long ago pointed out the anomaly and the resultant disgrace existing in that regard. Surely when the Legislature again meets the requisite statute or amendment will be enacted to prevent either licensed rum-sellers, or persons convicted of breaking a prohibitory law from sitting at the Council Board. Moreover it ought to be made clear on the statute book that a conviction for breaking the law should vacate the seat of any Councillor so convicted.

Until such changes are made the people must submit to the conditions now existing, humiliating as they are. A Councillor may be in the Police Court in the morning, and be there tried, convicted and sentenced to heavy fine and imprisonment, and in the evening take his seat at the Council Board. The man for whom the Police have been looking with a commitment under which they ought to take him to jail may turn up as Chairman of the Police Committee, and summoning the Marshal and Police before him with the authority of a master. That such conditions exist is not only shameful and humiliating. It is a reflection upon our civilization.

The late Mrs. Kruger had been the wife of Paul Kruger for over fifty years. She was the mother of sixteen children. Four sons, six sons-in-law and forty three grandsons fought in the war. She was herself a prisoner at the time of her last illness and death, but had been most kindly treated and continued to reside in the Presidential residence at Pretoria till the last. A pathetic interest attaches to the death of this devout woman under the circumstances. To the minds of the people of the Transvaal she was a veritable Mother in Israel.

Cecil Rhodes and Dr. Jameson, who are now again in England, are said to be rigidly silent in regard to the South African war. There is a sufficient reason. Before the war they had represented to the British public that the Boer threats were simply bravado, and that in the event of hostilities breaking out the conquest of the two Republics would be easy. They seem to have really believed this, although it has turned out to be such a huge mistake in working.

Hon. C. A. Parsons, the inventor of the steam turbine, claims remarkable possibilities for this form of motor, chiefly in developing speed on the ocean. The Viper, a 57 knot torpedo boat destroyer, now the fastest steamer in the world, is propelled by the steam turbine. He says the speed of his boats will yet be 45 knots, or a little over 80 land miles per hour. This will exceed the ordinary express train in speed and match all but the very fastest of railway travel.

Dr. Tanner, the famous long distance runner, has challenged "the medical profession, the brewers and distillers" to name six champions to meet him on the lists of starvation, so to speak. He is to drink water only; the other fellows may drink beer or whiskey, and the result to prove a total abstinence lesson or the reverse. This will afford a chance for those who claim there is nutriment in beer or whiskey to make good their claims. Tanner has stipulated that the contest shall take place five thousand feet above sea level, but what is the object of this does not appear.

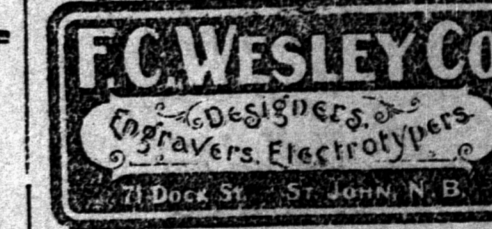
