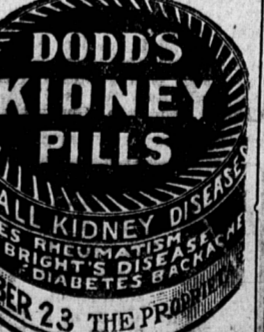
PORT HOOD COAL MINE IS FLOODED SYDNEY, June 26.—A report which reached town today states that the colliery at Port Hood is badly flooded.
