THE WILL of the late F. W. Hales was probated yesterday. The value of the estate consisted of shares in the Dominion Iron and Steel Co. in the Charlottetown Steam Nav. Co., with other property amounting to a little over \$3,000. The testator bequeath all his household furniture, household effects and books to his daughter Mary, wife of William D. Pollock. The executors are Mary Pollock, T. C. James, and C. R. Smallwood. It is directed that all the real and personal property shall be converted into money; and the whole estate, after the payment of the legacy above mentioned and of the just debts of the testator, and the winding up of the estate, be divided into ten equal parts. Two-tenths are to be paid to his daughter Hannah, wife of T. C. James; one-tenth to his son Henry, of Orleans, Minnesota; one-tenth to his son Frederick, Sauk Rapids, Michigan; one-tenth to his son Arthur E. of Hallowell, Minn.; one-tenth to Rev. Thomas R. O'Meara, Rector of Trinity Church, Toronto, to be used for his children for the testator's two grandchildren, Kathleen and Arthur H. O'Meara, children of the testator's deceased daughter Louisa and the Rev. Charles O'Meara, of Monroe, Michigan, said amount or share to be for their education or advancement, as the said Rev. Thomas R. O'Meara should decide. The remaining four-tenths are to be paid to his daughter Mary D. Pollock.

INVASION WILL BE PEACEFUL

OTTAWA, Feb. 24.—During August next Canada is to be invaded by a large body of New England militia men. Arrangements have been also completed for an excursion of about twelve hundred of them to Montreal and Ottawa on the 18th and 19th of next August. The corps which are coming are the 5th, National Guards of Boston numbering 800, the Governor's Food Guards of New Haven numbering 150; the Amoskeag Veterans, of New Hampshire, numbering 150 and 300 British naval and military veterans of Massachusetts.

FIGHTING IN EAST AFRICA

CAPE TOWN, Feb. 24.—The Cape Times' correspondent in German East Africa, under date of Jan. 29th, reports that a powerful impi of the Wangoni tribe has invaded the eastern confines of Luangabani Province, at the north east end of Lake Nyassa. There has been severe fighting with the German troops. Capt. Weiss was killed and a detachment of native troops massacred. The rebels are capturing much ammunition. Major Johannes, with 400 men, is making a sweeping movement from the east.
