THE NEW YORK LETTER.

The Much Talked of Shirt Waist Man Causes Much Interest.

THE WORLD'S REPRESENTATIVE REFUSED

Service at the Waldorf and Shanley Restaurants. Day by Day the Number Wearing the New Fad Grows.

Now it's the shirt-waist man. New York must always have some sort of freakish sensation and it has it for fair in the individual above mentioned. He is a product of hot weather—the natural, logical and yet eccentric product of his temperature—environment; a product of the peculiar Summer conditions which prevail in the world's greatest city, a child of Broadway needing not to be ashamed. The Shirt-Waist man as you probably know is the man who scorns to wear in public places the coat which "conventionality"—that amateurish tyrant—forces upon most of the sons of men. In New York about a month ago, there arose one righteous man to save the sweltering city. He said, "why should I be as that man who to-day is, and to-morrow is cast into the oven, through wearing a stuffy coat in weather so hot that even the ice-man is prostrated." Whereupon he got him a shirt of pattern so rich and aggressive that those who met him heard the music as of a brass-band, got him an enamelled belt, and sallied forth on Broadway. And men seeing him were led to go and do likewise so that now the city is agog with this new star in the firmament, the Shirt-Waist Man, beside whom the Man Behind the Gun looks like unto thirty sesterling.

On Broadway in this fearful weather, in which people are dropping like poisoned flies, you can count the Shirt Waist Man by dozens. His shirts are a perfect riot of color, in stripes and spangles and squares. Haberdashers are sitting up late at night to devise patterns of sufficient violence to commend them to the

There has been quite a divertissement created in the swell restaurants as to admitting the Shirt Waist Man to sit at meat. The World got one of the "new" men to try it on the Waldorf, Shanley's and Rector's, the other evening—at all of three of which places a glass of water and a toopick can be readily had for a quarter. The Shirt Waist Man was refused service at the Waldorf and Shanley's but was welcomed at Rector's, probably the most expensive place at which to eat in the world. There are only one or two food-factories in town in fact to whom the new man is not persona in grata. But he flourishes in beauty and comeliness, and day by day the accessions to his ranks grow. No doubt next summer will see a coatless, braces-less, perspiration-less New York, and a poet must arise to sing another "Song of the Shirt."

FITZ FITS AGAIN.

Robert Fitzimmons, alias "Ruby Bob" "Fitz," "Kangaroo," also called an "also-ran" and a "has been" and a "back-number," appeared by "special request" last evening at Madison Square Garden in a little controversy with Mr. Gus Ruhlin. "Fitz" has been, by merit raised to the bad eminence of the false god of American heathenism. And the worship of Baal in this fashion prevails extensively in a land that is horrified at the barbarity of Spanish bull-fights but delights in seeing creatures in human shape pummeling one another into shapelessness. Robert was booked for defeat by all the wise guys, who called—past tense be sure—him the "old man." In the second round however, Robert handed out a petty little collection of solar plexus, "jolt" and "jars," also "swings" and "hooks" and "uppercuts" such as soon sent Mr. Ruhlin into the happy land of dreams. It was all so "sudden." Before that vast audience of 12000 people, delighting in this sort of alleged "manliness," and including every "sport" of note in America, Fitzimmons

showed that his cunning had not left him, but that he is yet next to the greatest, if not really the greatest, pugilist in the world. He is 33 years old, but his "form" last night was said by experts to have been amazing. He sent all his worshippers into frenzies of delight,—they kissed and hugged the old champion, who is the best-loved prize-fighter alive to-day. Yesterday morning he was found frolicking with his two boys and little girl on the sands at Bergen Beach! Last night by an astounding exhibition of every artifice and device known to the debased literature of slugging, he paralyzed Ruhlin into 12 minutes unconsciousness and earned just \$12,300 in 20 minutes. Ruhlin gets \$1,000 as soon as his doctors can bring him round. Fitz has "such a way with him." "Good old John L." of slugging notoriety, was "there-always" an admirer of Fitz, as like to like must needs be. "How's the fight going to go, John?" somebody asked. With a contemptuous grunt the old champion replied "Why Fitz has a cinch." So it was. And yet what a spectacle in this age and in sight of so many churches!

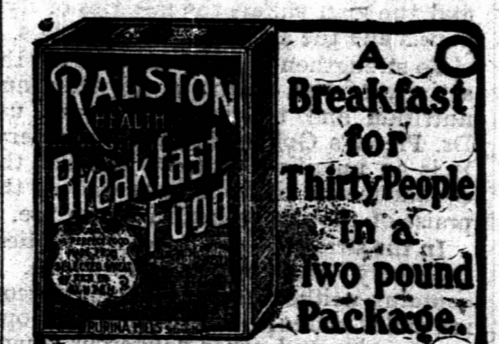
