Australian Foreign Minister Replies To Times Charges

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA, Oct. 31 (AP)—Foreign Minister H.V. Evatt said today that Hanson W. Baldwin, military editor of the New York Times, had been "inaccurate and intemperate" in saying that Australian labor and internal affairs were hampering Gen. Douglas MacArthur and the United Nations War Effort.

Evatt declared Baldwin had not visited Australia and had obtained his information from a few persons who had returned to the United States after failing in Australia.

Evatt said calling the Government's commitment is false.

Take for instance Baldwin's reference to Gen. MacArthur. Evatt said he has never been subject to any direction or control whatsoever by the war cabinet or the war council. Baldwin's fallacious attempt to assign the entire credit for improvement in this theatre to America is unfair.

Every fair-minded American and "I myself," said Evatt, "have heard MacArthur speak in the most glowing terms of the splendid leadership and work of the United States Government. I imagine the truth is that Baldwin's somewhat recent conversion in assessing great importance to the Pacific area made him look around for justification of his past indifference.

"I believe all this belittling of Australians displays the greatest ingratitude. Australia is most grateful to America for what has been done, although Britain has greatly helped us.

The United States should be equally grateful for what Australia has done for the United Nations. The United States Air Force here knows where the truth lies and so does the United States Government. The fair-minded United States Government will pass judgment on this country, which speaking proportionately is second to none among the United Nations."

Nazi New Order Old And Bad

"The Nazi 'new order' is not new, is the oldest of which history has any record. It is an order of despotism, tyranny, and the crushing of individual freedom. It is very old, very hard, and ultimately very rotten." This view of Hitler's boasted new order was expressed by Dr. H. J. Cody, president of the University of Toronto, when he discussed the peril threatening civilization, in an address to the Maritime Women's Club of Montreal in Tudor Hall Wednesday night.

Reviewing fundamental trends in recent world history, Dr. Cody noted that the two outstanding movements of the nineteenth century were democracy and nationalism. There came a realization of the interdependence of nations and after the last war an effort was made to organize an expression of this interdependence, but the experiment failed.

"Nationalism by itself may become perilous, and the most recent development is the threat of sinister, diabolical, totalitarianism, swallowing the individual citizen, and by reason of an assumed superiority seeking to dominate the world," Dr. Cody suggested that after the victory is won Europe, which has been the cultural leader for the world, will have to share with the western continent as protagonists of civilization. There would be thought, be a fresh effort to link nations in good will, but this time the organization would have to be of a federal character, empowered to keep the peace of the world.

This war is first and foremost a war for survival, Dr. Cody pointed out. In Canada we are a long way out, but a little nearer than we thought, since recent attacks on the Atlantic Coast and invasion in the Aleutian Islands, close to this continent on the Pacific. This is the kind of war we cannot have weak, the right of the individual, mental integrity, ideals of duty, respect for law and order, kindness and chivalrous regard for the weak, the right of the individual, three things, accompanied by Mrs. being repudiated, scorned, derided and destroyed by desperate Nazi attacks.

speech at Nice:—"She (France) must above all defend her Empire and even aim at a triumphant counter-attack."
