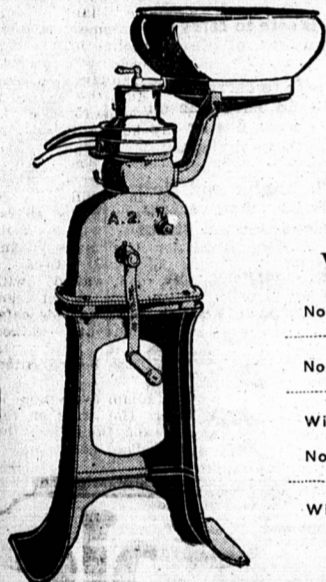

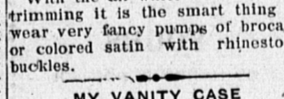
Judgment Given in County Court

At the County Court of Queen's yesterday morning, judgment was delivered in the case of Patrick MacMillan vs. Benjamin Arsenault, an action to recover fifty dollars for additional work done on a building contract at the request of defendant. Judge Stewart in handing down a judgment for the plaintiff with costs stated that the defendant had exceeded his authority in performing the extra work that formed the subject of the suit, and therefore was not entitled to receive payments supplementary to his contract.

He also referred to the fact that Mr. Gaudet, the defendant's attorney had invoked the right of set off and had asked for a judgment for the defendant of \$100 for breach of contract. Judge Stewart stated that though in all other English speaking countries, the law of set-off complies with modern needs and allows defendant suitors to set off damage against debt damages and equitable claims against legal claims, Canadian legislature had until several years ago been satisfied with an antiquated and discarded system, nearly one hundred years behind the times.

There was instituted in 1922 "an act to amend the Common Law Procedure Act of 1873," enacting as follows: "The defendant in an action in the Supreme Court may set off against the claim of the plaintiff any right or claim whether such set off is a debt or grounds in damages." "This provision" stated Judge Stewart, "is confined to the Supreme Court, and the County Court, where the greatest number of actions are tried, must still follow a cramped and gone by procedure, to the annoyance and disappointment of suitors. Even if an appeal case were taken from the County Court the Supreme Court at the hearing would be unable to invoke the provisions of the Amendment Act, which is confined exclusively to an action brought in the Supreme Court."
