## SAD TALE OF NORTH: DR. FLOOD PERISHED HUNTING LOST GRUB

### Story of a Dog's Devotion; Other Sled Dogs Ran Away, but the Leader Remained and Met Death With His Master

WINNIPEG, February 18.—Further details of the tragic death of Sergeant Flood, R. N. W. M. P., of Fort Churchill, who was frozen to death in the great storm of November 29, have been learned from W. Beech, the postmaster who brought the first tidings to civilization. According to Beech's story, Dr. Flood, Major Moodie and Engineer Thibadeau, who had been surveying the harbor and coast reserve for the Federal Government at Fort Churchill, left home on November 28 for the purpose of exploring for timber. When they left the weather was fair, and everything looked favorable for them. They prepared a camp up country, and proceeded to that, but when they arrived they found that they had dropped their grub box on the way and were without food. Laughingly the fact was noticed by Dr. Flood, and it was thought that it was not far away. With a light heart the doctor said that he would go back for it, and he joyfully created Major Moodie's offer of assistance.

Beech has ever seen. The thermometer fell to 25 below, and the wind blew 60 miles an hour. The damp atmosphere along the coast of the bay makes 25 be low extremely cold, and much worse than forty below in Winnipeg. The dogs which broke loose from the sled and their faithful leader, returned to Churchill seven days after they had left the camp on their ill-fated journey in search of the grub box. The body of Dr. Flood was buried at the barracks at Churchill and his is in the first grave, and the first death in the history of the Royal Northwest Mounted Police in the Hudson Bay district. Dr. Flood was 30 years of age and went north from Quebec, where he was born. A brother is now resident in Winnipeg.

## MOTOR BOATS BATTLE STORM

### Crew of the Muriel Cut Anchors to Save Her

NAUSA, Bahamas Island, Feb. 18.—Owing to a thunderstorm only two of the six entries of the "Flag-to-Flag" motor boat race left Miami, Fla., last Tuesday. Four of the boats declining to start on account of the rough weather. The auxiliary Muriel, of the New York Motor Boat Club, arrived here at noon today after a very severe struggle with the elements. Her engine broke down at the start and had to be repaired. The Muriel at Castle Rocks came to anchor. She dragged her anchors, however, and had drifted to within fifty feet of the breakers when her crew cut away both anchors and she got clear under her own power. The Muriel is fifty five feet long, has two masts, and a ten horse-power engine.
