Scottish Shipbuilding

During the first five years of the war, to the end of September 1944, Clyde shipbuilding, repairing and engineering firms built, converted or repaired naval and merchant vessels to a total number of 21,237.

Construction work was begun in June on the damming and raising of the level of Loch Sloy, near the head of Loch Lomond, and the erection of a large power station.
