Registration of Motor Vehicles

Owners of motor vehicles, chauffeurs and others are reminded that permits and licenses under "The Motor Vehicle Law" of this Province, expire on the 1st May.

Applications for registration for the current year, whether cars previously registered or not, should be made at once on the revised forms furnished by the Provincial Secretary, Charlottetown. The annual tax and war tax and fees is as follows:

MOTOR VEHICLES
Annual Tax—(Including War Tax) 60 cents per 100 lbs. weight. The fractional part of 100 lbs. over 49 lbs. charged for as 100 lbs. 49 lbs. and under not charged for.
Registration fee—1st year \$5. Second year as owner of car \$2.
Markers—\$1.25 per set. Old markers to be returned.

MOTOR TRUCKS
Annual Tax—One ton capacity \$10. Every additional ton capacity or smallest fraction thereof \$5 extra.
War Tax—One-third of annual tax to be added.
Registration fee—1st year \$5. Second year as owner of car \$2.
Markers—\$1.25 per set. Old markers to be returned.

MOTOR CYCLES
Annual Tax—\$5. War Tax \$1.67. Annual registration fee \$2. Markers \$1.25. Total annually \$9.92

DEALERS LICENSES
Annual tax—(Including one set of markers) \$20. War tax \$6.67. Registration fee \$5.00. Total annually \$31.67. Additional Dealers Markers per set \$2.00.

CHAUFFEURS
Annual tax—\$2. War tax 67 cents. Annual registration fee \$2. Badge 50 cents. Total \$5.17.

Sunday School Lesson

SIN AND ITS CONSEQUENCES

Gen. 13: 1-13

Sunday School Lesson, May 11, 1919

Satan coming to Eve in the guise of a serpent, tempted her. He knew human nature too well to deal with her openly; that would have been a failure. So he resolved to deceive the woman. "Hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? Do you really think you may not enjoy as much of the fruit as you like? Take all you want; there is no harm in it. The trick was to make evil seem no evil, at all, to make it a perfectly safe thing for the woman to take whatever she would. It is the nature of sin to conceal its frightfulness. A naturalist tells of a brilliant spider on the Amazon, which spreads itself out like a flower; the insects coming in search of sweetness find instead horror and death. So is sin. Deceive men as much as it will regarding the guilt, sin is a dreadful thing; it is the breaking of God's holy law.

Satan's first attempt failed. The woman assumed him that God had forbidden the eating from the tree which was in the midst of the garden. But one defeat was not sufficient to discourage the Tempter; He now resorted to another kind of trickery; he would deceive her as to the results of sin. "Ye shall not surely die," he said. "Not only shall you not be harmed, but you shall be helped. In the day you eat thereof your eyes shall be opened and you shall be as gods. God himself knows how true this is." So Satan reasoned. This too, is one of the common deceits of sin. It offers certain advantages to the tempted, promises that he will gain by the indulgence. That there is a shade of truth in this we all know, and that makes the falsehood all the more dangerous. If a man could find no pleasure in sin, he would not indulge in it. He does for the moment, and is never all that was expected; and after that—what? Sin is deceptive as to consequences. Beware!

As the woman looked at the tree the fruit became more winsome every moment. The luscious fruit seemed good for food, pleasant to the eyes, desirable to make one wise, until at last she took thereof, and did eat. Here again the woman was deceived, and this time she was deceived as to the character of sin. As she dabbled with temptation her imagination clothed the fruit with rare beauty till at last the evil of eating seemed to be a form of good. This is another of the Tempter's tricks; he makes vice glow with the lustre of virtue. Paul says that Satan himself is transformed "into an angel of light." He hides his vicious face under a mask and appears angelic. But evil is evil, whatever shape it may take or whatever name it may assume. Do not be mistaken as to its real character.

After the woman had sinned she became temptress to her husband. She had taken from the tree for herself; she now offered of the fruit to him, and he also ate. Sin is social in its nature; it likes company. Does a man put into his mouth that which steals away his brains? Then he asks a friend to drink with him; and thus another is sent on the way to ruin. If evil would only stay within the bounds of the sinner's own life the case would not be so bad, though had enough at best. But that is what it will not do; it reaches out to drag down some other. So in ever-widening areas the dreadful thing goes on, and no one can tell this side of the Judgment Day how far-extending the results have been.

After Adam and Eve had sinned their eyes were opened, but in quite another way than they had been promised. They were expecting to be exalted as gods. They were humbled instead, and a sense of shame came over them. Such is the usual outcome of sin. Not only are its flattering promises
