17,000 APPLY FOR GRANT AND LESS THAN 10,000 SERVED.

OTTAWA, May 6.—The militia departments is being deluged with applications for hundred dollar grants from men who say they were veterans of the "Fenian raids of 1866-70," some hundreds of these applications are based upon a misconception of the conditions governing the granting. They are said to be fraudulent.

There are it is estimated less than ten thousand bonifide veterans who saw active service in 1866-70. There are already seventeen thousand applications and every day adds hundreds more, many of three applying, appear to think that if they turned out for drill in 1870, they are entitled to the grant, and they are sending in applications backed by comrades' declarations, in one instance the department has information that declarations were explained on a promise to share the grant and a prosecution is likely to result in the case, and perhaps in others.
