Late Blight Menace

The potato industry, on which so much of the
agricultural wealth of this Province depends, is
being threatened just now by the prevalence

There were few potato bugs and with the hot
weather that prevailed early in the season many
growers were lulled into a false sense of security

This warning applies to both growers and
dealers. Where a field is now blighted, the spores
which cause the rot in the tubers are present in

Another point emphasized by the authorities
is that when harvesting, a fine, bright day should
be chosen, and the potatoes allowed to lie on the

Observance of these precautions will we are
assured, save a lot of trouble later on.
