**GERMAN DIVISION TAKEN AS PRISONERS**

PETROGRAD, Dec. 9.—The entire staff of the Eighty-second German army division was captured by Russian mounted scouts and brought as prisoners into the Russian lines as the result of a daring night raid recently according to unofficial accounts which have just been received.

Under cover of darkness, a small company of scouts worked its way past the German trenches towards the German bases, the details as received here run. Emerging from a wood, the scouts found themselves close to a village. They stopped and sent forward a reconnoitering party.

The latter soon came upon a German sentry, who gave the alarm. Ten minutes later a German cavalry squadron galloped out of the village, followed by two companies of Austrian landsturm troops. The Russians meanwhile had dismounted, hiding their horses and concealing themselves.

Fell into Ambush

The Germans and Austrians fell into the ambush and became panic-stricken when the Russians opened fire. The Germans were running for their lives and throwing down their rifles. In the confusion, the German cavalry, not knowing how large a force might be opposing them, also retreated, many troopers falling under the Russian fire.

The Russians were ordered to follow on foot into the village. They came upon a large estate and through the windows of the mansion made out the figures of German officers. Half of the foris of scouts made for the mansion while the others continued their pursuit of the retreating troops.

Rushed the Mansion

A rush for the doors of the mansion was made by ten Cossacks and so quick was the progress of events that the German officers did not have time to secure their coats and furs before they were hustled outside.

By this time the other division of the party had returned and searched the mansion which proved to be a division staff headquarters and secured valuable papers. The whole incident took place in less than fifteen minutes.

With their prisoners, the scouts began to retire. The German cavalry men meanwhile had reformed and attempted to cut off the Russian retreat. The prisoners were sent back under convoy, however, it is declared, and the retreat covered by the bulk of the scouts, who also succeeded in return-

ing to the Russian lines with small losses.

Dr. C. McQ. Avard, coroner, was called, and finding that all precautions had been taken by the administration of the anaesthetic decided an inquest was unnecessary. He states that no fault can be attached to either the physician or dentist. The deceased was 21 years of age, and a fine type of physical strength. Both his father and mother died some years ago, and he is survived by his mother, one sister. The body was taken to Christie's undertaking parlors and will be conveyed to his old town for interment.

**Bulgarians Announce French Defeat**

SOFIA, December 8.—The annihilation of a French battalion by a Bulgarian bayonet attack during a battle in Southern Serbia, is announced in an official statement issued today by the Bulgarian army headquarters. Substantial progress in the operations against the French, as far south as Kemir-Kapu, on the Vardar river, is reported in the statement which follows:

"Our troops continue their pursuit of the French on both sides of the river. We occupied the railway station at Demir-Kapu and are now twelve kilometers (about seven miles) east of the station.

"Our troops approached the village of Grabica from three sides. A battle ensued, lasting until midnight. One of our columns attacked a French battalion near the village of Petroz, south of the Sudova station. The battalion was annihilated by a bayonet attack, and its encampment captured.

"Our troops operating south of Strumitza, have advanced to the south of Kosturino.
