Many plans have been proposed by which to effect a closer union of the various portions of the British Empire. For a good while after the union of the Canadian Provinces under the federal system there was much talk of a federation of the Empire along similar lines. The general idea was a supreme Parliament and Executive to deal only with the more important national and international affairs, in which supreme Parliament and Executive the Three Kingdoms and the Colonies would have representation, while each would have its own Legislature and Government to deal with local and subordinate matters. This plan would have given much closer organic union throughout the Empire and would have given to both Ireland and Scotland the legislative control of their internal affairs while relieving the Imperial Parliament of the mass local legislation with which it is now encumbered.

But the plan came to be discarded as impractical. The Colonies received it coldly and probably leading up to sharing the responsibility and cost of the army and navy and of wars brought about solely on account of relations between the United Kingdom and nations of continental Europe, for objects with which Canada, Australia, South Africa or India might have no material concern. Another plan proposed was to give the Colonies some sort of representation in the present House of Commons, or House of Lords or both, without adopting the federal system. This was found to be full of grave difficulties. The Colonies would certainly object to taxation without representation and why should the Mother Country give them representation without obtaining with it the right of taxation? Sir Frederick Pollock in a letter to the London Times, after discussing the above and other plans attempts to give the present trend of thought on the problem of imperial unity among a number of the leading men of the Empire, but adds that for the present it has been thought best not to give the names of these men.

Setting aside the proposal of imperial federation and the latter proposal of direct representation of the Colonies in the British Parliament as now constituted, Sir Frederick Pollock proceeds:

"There remains one organ of our national Constitution which is still capable of being adapted to new functions. This is the Privy Council, of which the Cabinet itself is an informal committee. . . . It seems that, if an effective addition to the Council of the Empire is to be made, we must look to the Privy Council to supply the machinery for it."

In brief his proposal is that there should be a Committee of the Privy Council for Imperial affairs. This Committee should collect and digest information on Imperial questions, and would have a permanent secretarial staff. The Prime Minister of the United Kingdom might be the head of this Committee and delegates might be summoned to attend regularly on the recommendation of each of the self-governing Colonies, or the head of the Committee might invite the Premiers or other Ministers of those Colonies to attend when desirable. Members of the Committee might then be called in by the British Cabinet to consult when important Imperial questions were to be decided upon.

The Winnipeg Tribune in discussing Sir Frederick Pollock's proposals thinks he is upon the right track but has not hit upon quite the right solution. The Tribune suggests that each of the self-governing Colonies ought to have in its Cabinet a Minister directly and expressly responsible for its external relations, say a Minister of Imperial and Foreign Affairs, and that these Colonial Ministers with certain Ministers of the British Cabinet might compose the Imperial Council. The suggestion is an interesting one, and it has the great merit of simplicity. It seems the best plan yet proposed to solve the problem of how to combine Imperial and Colonial action in regard to external questions without loss on any side of the principle of Ministerial responsibility. It would be a step in the direction of Imperial unity, apparently a gradual and safe advance, and any advance along a new and untried path in matters of such gravity ought to be gradual and well-considered.
