The Fat Case in Method.

Str.—As Secretary of the P. E. Island Dairy Association, it might perhaps be a place to submit something tending towards the settlement of this difficult question. When appointed Secretary of the Association last Spring, this was one of the questions I thought would engage my attention. I may say I was then a disciple of Mr. McLaren's.

Mr. Morrow, our Inspector, was then in Kingston Dairy School and I thought it a good time to get some scientific facts. After considerable cross firing I got the following extract from Mr. Morrow and concluded to give up the controversy, thinking that after all I might not have crapped with the question intelligently and had better let men of science and close observation both as to the experiment and thought have something to say in determining the point. Below is the letter referred to:—

In regard to the value of milk for cheese-making, Prof. Van Slyke, of New York Experiment Station, who is reckoned the highest authority on this point, says:—

"Of all practical methods suggested, the use of milk fat as a basis in paying for milk for cheese-making gives the nearest approach to absolute fairness." As the result of several seasons' work in testing and analysing milk sent to a cheese factory, he says "In speaking of the modified milk fat method (adding two to the fat percentage):—It gives a marked advantage in favor of the poorer milk, nearly six times as great a difference as there should justly be." "If any fixed factor is to be added, the figure that will give results in closest agreement with the yield and composition of the cheese is 0.3." Thus 3 per cent milk would be called 3.3; 4 per cent milk 4.3 and so on.

Van Slyke says further that the milk fat basis is the fairest practicable. (1)—Because the amount of fat in milk offers the most accurate, practicable and just basis we have for determining the cheese-producing value of milk.

(2)—Because this method recognizes the fundamental truth that different milks possess different values for cheese-making.

(3)—It guarantees pay for what is in the milk that makes cheese. I might add that the modified milk fat method (adding 2 to fat reading) will prove a temptation to skim and water milk. One man delivers say 100 lbs of 4% milk which nets him 100. His neighbor takes 100 lbs. of water and adds to his 100 lbs of milk, which originally tested 4% 200 lb @ 2% x 2 = 8. He will get 100 x 3 = 1.33

for his milk or 33 cents per hundred more. This is an extreme case but simply shows what a temptation it might prove to some patrons."

I trust this may be of interest to your readers I may say this correspondence was private and not carried on under the direction of the Association, hence the reason for not appearing before.

THE MILK QUESTION.

Reply to Fairviewer by Mount Albion Viewer.

SIR,—I see, in reply to Sarwak a correspondent signing himself Fairviewer, who does not agree with that letter as he thinks too much of the blame of bad cheese is laid upon the maker. He says further, that a maker cannot make flavor. I contend that the cheese will develop a bad flavor, if the makers are careless and do not understand their work, though the milk should be of the best quality. He also says that the makers are not able to detect bad flavors if the milk be aerated and cooled down.

When Mr. Dillon took charge of dairy stations on this Island he instructed the patrons to cool and air the milk before sending it to the factory. It is a well known fact that Mr. Dillon, when he undertook to run several factories, agreed with the companies to make cheese for a certain amount and guarantee the quality, but in all cases, he reserved the right to the maker to reject all milk that would not make first class cheese, showing clearly that the maker is responsible for the quality of cheese. Is there any cheese-maker, who will acknowledge to his inability to detect bad flavor in milk? If any or all would acknowledge this the protection to quality is gone. . . .
