LONDON, May 2 (Special)—Great Britain has made urgent diplomatic representations to the Republic of Guatemala to obtain a settlement of claims of British holders of Guatemalan bonds, which have been outstanding for many years. The total amount involved is \$7,000,000. The British government has asked the support of the United States for the protection of the interests of the bondholders.

AN ADDITIONAL INDICTMENT AGAINST JACK JOHNSON

CHICAGO, April 30.—An additional indictment amendatory of previous indictment was returned today by the federal grand jury charging Jack Johnson, the negro prize fighter, with violation of the Mann White Slave Act. The indictment alleges that Johnson brought Belle Schreiber, "otherwise known as Mrs. Johnson," from Pittsburg to Chicago, October 15, 1910, "for immoral purposes" and "in perpetration of a serious crime." The fighter was in court when the indictment was read and entered a plea of not guilty. His trial is set for next Monday.

MILITIA CALLED TO QUELL STRIKE RIOTS

AUBURN, N. Y., April 30.—Militia called out last night did not prevent rioting at the International Harvesters Company twine mills this morning and for a time there were pitched battles between police, soldiers, deputies and strikers. SHERBROOKE, Que., April 30.—Herbert Bogie, Selby, Ellsworth Cross and Will Cross, who are held on the charge of being criminally responsible for the death of Frank Cross at Ulster on April 23, appeared before District Magistrate Macdonald today. J. E. Perreault, Advocate, appeared on behalf of the crown, and after the prisoners had been arraigned a motion was made to have the preliminary inquiry adjourned until next Friday. This was granted and the accused were again remanded to jail.
