Butter Duty Will Protect Home Product

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) OTTAWA, April 1.—Benefit from a Federal Order-in-Council providing for an exchange dumping duty on New Zealand butter entering Canada were forecast for Nova Scotia Saturday by F. W. Walsh, director of marketing for the province.

Butter Duty Will Protect Home Product

"This ought to solve the problem in Nova Scotia," he declared. "Apparently it will prevent profit making on New Zealand butter. From the information now before me, I would say the new duty will have a re-assuring and stabilizing effect on the Nova Scotia market."

Other officials estimated the duty would average three or four cents a pound—enough, they said, to make importations unprofitable. The duty is calculated on the basis of \$4.86 2-1/2 per pound sterling, with the difference between this and the New Zealand pound's exchange rate being applied as the special tariff.
