pulse then rose and the wand twisted rapidly. He reached the gardener's house, which he declared the men had entered, and some children confessed that three men (whom they described) had come into the house one Sunday morning. Aymer followed the track up the river, pointed out all the places where the men had landed, and stopped at last at the door of the prison of Beaucarre. He was admitted, looked at the prisoners and plucked out the murderer, who had just been brought in for a small theft.

Aymer's Mistake. This man confessed that he had been an accomplice, and was broken on the wheel. Aymer chased the other assassins to the coast, followed them by sea, landed where they had landed, and only desisted from his search when they crossed the country. Such a detective is the divining rod in the right hands; but, alas! Aymer was no better than detectives who

follow the approved process of "ratiocination". Instead of retiring after his memorable achievement, or lucky hit, he made all sorts of blunders and lost his reputation for sagacity. He couldn't find the guilty. Again and again the veracious wand pointed at the innocent, in vain did Aymer plead

that it was a peculiarity of his rod not to "indicate a murderer who had confessed, or who was drunk when he committed his crime." His gifted rod turned into a poor stick. If we have to abandon faith in the divining rod as a detective, we may at least console ourselves with the reflection that

the magic rod is ancient and classical. Virgil's fame as a great magician, told with such charm at learning by Comparetti in "Virg in the Middle Ages", is said to have originated in the confusion between his name and the word virgula, the wand of magical daimonies.
