In conversation with Rev. T. J. Bradshaw, China, on Monday the Rev. gentleman gave the following facts:

The common people of China in recent troubles were friendly to the missionaries. The officials and literary class were not only unfriendly, but hostile, toward foreigners. They refer to opium being forced upon them and their resources being gobbled up by such men as J. B. Morgan and other men of a like calibre. They speak of the graves of their ancestors being disturbed by engineers. The superstition of the Chinese is remarkable and yet they will not admit it. They say "until we know earth why should we seek to know Heaven." "As to what the powers have accomplished, I may say they have accomplished nothing, or worse than nothing. China is not conquered and never can be. When the Powers try to punish she retreats and no army dare follow lest their exit be cut off. China is a country of great distances. The powers say we will punish by killing some of her men and in this the Chinamen laugh and say we have hundreds of millions of a population. The Powers say we will make you pay an indemnity; the Chinamen say but the amount is to be raised by increased tax on foreign trade. The Powers have aroused a military spirit and from one end to the other China is secretly arming and drilling for a desperate struggle. For the present there is to be peace in China and only the speedy evangelization of a large portion of the population can make that peace permanent." Mr. Bradshaw will go to Bedeque this morning.
