tacked by the Russians were replaced with great losses to the in- vaders.

Seven Russian warplanes braved snow and Arctic winds to bomb Helsinki in the southeast, between 20 and 30 missiles in the fourth succes- sive day of air raids, but in the Finnish capital and numerous vil- lages hereabouts, which also were bombed, there were no reports of casualties. Property damage was slight.

One Soviet Union plane was shot down over Helsinki.

The Finnish air force took the offensive in the southeast, break- ing up enemy columns and camps, destroying munitions dumps and bombing the town of Terijoki, oc- cupied by the Russians and seat of the Moscow-sponsored "People's Government" for Finland.

A Finnish source declared that during the invasion which began Nov. 30, the Russians used 1,000 tanks on the Kare- lian Isthmus alone, and that to date the Finns have destroyed 250 tanks on all fronts.

Reports from Copenhagen said the Russian retreat in the north- west Petsamo region of Finland is continuing hastily and without fighting.

From the Norwegian side a long line of Russian warships is moving steadily northward toward the north.

The region was strangely silent, these dispatches said, with none of the machine gun bursts and rifle fire that have been heard throughout the Arctic area for the last three weeks.

The Finns apparently were con- tent to follow the retreating Russians and not to fight as long as the Red army troops kept moving briskly in retreat.

Nazi Germany's naval activity in the second Great War appears to be based on lessons learned from failures in the first Great War.

Many students of the last conflict were of opinion that had Germany started unrestricted submarine warfare earlier and continued ruthlessly, unmovable by protests and threats from the United States, she could have brought Great Britain to a state of helplessness.
